Chairman of the State Administration Council Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services Senior General Min Aung Hlaing received Deputy Commander-in-Chief of Russian Navy Vice-Admiral Vladimir Lvovich Kasatonov and delegation members on board Russian Warship Gremyashiy on 29 October.

The Senior General and party were welcomed by Deputy Commander-in-Chief of Russian Navy Vice-Admiral Vladimir Lvovich Kasatonov, Commanding Officer of the Warship Captain Andrey Kuznetsov at the Thilawa port.

- The Senior General took the salute of the Guard of Honour on board the Russian Warship Gremyashiy and was honoured and saluted by the national anthems of the two countries.
- The Senior General presented foodstuff and other food items manufactured by Tatmadaw factories to officers and other

ranks of the Russian naval ship.

- The Senior General received the delegation led by the Deputy Commander-in-Chief at the meeting room of Gremyashiy. At the meeting, they exchanged views on maritime security technology and information between the two navies of the two countries.
- The Senior General and party looked around the Gremyashiy and discussed technical cooperation in war vessel building.

It is reported that the historic resistance park in Yangon region will reopen to the public on 1 November.





## Chairman of the State Administration Council Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing Inspected Myanma Thakaung War Veterans' Housing

Chairman of the State Administration Council Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing accompanied by Council members, Yangon region Chief Minister and officials inspected Myanma Thakaung war veterans' housing (Laydauntkan) in Dagon Myothit (South) township of Yangon region on 29 October. The officials reported to the Senior General on completion of the housing and settlement of war veterans.

After hearing the reports, the Senior General stressed the following points:

- The Myanma Thakaung War Veterans' Housing (Laydauntkan) is being built as a war veteran city. It is also necessary to build a model housing to contribute to the development of Yangon City.
- The town characteristics comprise supply of water and electricity as well as public places.
- It is necessary to consider the plan to generate electricity through solar energy for the future which is one of renewable energy.
- Upon completion, Myanma Thakaung War Veterans' Housing (Laydauntkan)

- will have a population like that of a town. Hence, relevant services must be given to the young and old people.
- Construction of the housing aims to ensure food and accommodations convenience for war veterans.
- Plans are underway to implement small and medium scale industries for creation of jobs for offspring of war veterans and it is necessary to consider the construction of the agriculture, livestock and technological schools.
- Emphasis must be placed on running of the circular trains as public transportation for convenience of those from the war veterans' housing and local people, said the Senior General.

## Committee on Prevention of Recruitment Child Soldiers Held its Meeting (2/2021)

Union Minister for Defence General Mya Tun Oo, Chairman of Committee on Prevention of Recruitment of Child Soldiers, presided over the Committee Meeting (2/2021) held at the meeting hall of the minister office of the Ministry of Defence on 29 October.

During the meeting,

 The Union Minister said the government and the Country Task Force on Monitoring and Reporting (CTFMR) signed the prevention of child soldier recruitment project on 27 June 2012.

- According to the project, Tatmadaw has already discharged 1,029 child soldiers who were mistakenly recruited and entrusted to their parents with the cooperation of CTFMR.
- Arrangements will be made for the resignation of the remaining underage soldiers scrutinized with the CTFMR.
- Tatmadaw is currently recruiting soldiers in accordance with the laws, rules and regulations as well as the provisions of the agreement reached between the Committee on Prevention of Recruit-



ment Child Soldiers and UNCTFMR.

• The committee holds the meeting every quarterly-month and the implementation progress of the meeting outcomes will also be reported to UNICEF.

The meeting was also attended by the committee members and relevant departmental officials.

## COVID-19 Prevention, Control, and Treatment Activities Continue in Respective Regions and States



Students aged 12 years and above vaccinated against COVID-19 in respective regions and states

In every state and region of Myanmar, the officials are accelerating the COVID-19 prevention, control and treatment activities such as, opening quarantine centres and continuing vaccination processes.

- A total of 98 closed contacts (40 males and 58 females) are taking necessary treatments at Nay Pyi Taw Interrogation and Accommodation centre.
- The vaccination processes continue in respective regions and states. As per the priority programme, a total of 139,901 people have been vaccinated against COVID-19 as second doses and 83,609

- people as first doses on 29 October.
- A total of 11,679 students aged 12 years and above from Basic Education Middle and High schools in respective regions and states have been vaccinated against COVID-19 on 29 October. A total of 958,799 students have been vaccinated against COVID-19 up to 29 October.
- Plans are underway to receive about 1,000 COVID-19 infected patients at Yankin COVID centre in Yangon city.
   Two oxygen plants, 600 oxygen concentrators and more than 500 oxygen cylinders (40 litres) are ready to treat the pa-

tients who need oxygen urgently.

The Ministry of Health has recently issued orders not to gather more than 50 people except for exceptional cases to prevent the spread of COVID-19 disease.

The Ministry of Health is conducting COVID-19 tests regularly, 905 new cases of

COVID-19 were found from testing a total of 20,248 samples and the infected rates are 4.47 percent on 29 October. Up to 29 October 2021, a total of 498,605 cases were found from testing a total of 4,830,979 samples and death toll reached 18,644.

#### Police Seized Firearms Hidden at RC Cemetery by a Priest Affiliating with Terrorist Groups in Haka Township

Acting on an information tip, security force members along with local officials opened four suspected graves in the RC cemetery of Kyaw Bote Ward of Haka Township and seized 17 single-shotguns, 84 assorted IEDs made up of PVC pipes and seven bulletproof vests on 28th October.

Regarding the above-mentioned incident, security forces continue necessary investigations and found out the following points:

- The police found a suspected person near the Bethlehem Baptist Church in Haka Township on 16 October. He ran away when they stopped him to examine.
- The security forces found a Huawei mobile phone nearby belonged to Van Kyan, Chin/Christian (Priest) who lived in Kyaw Bote Ward of Haka Township. Be-

sides, they also discovered the group photos of the priest holding a singleshotgun with the armed terrorists on his phone.

• It was reported that Van Kyan concealed the arms, ammunitions and related items in the graves of the cemetery as he was worried that the police would raid his house.

Regarding the case, security forces continue necessary investigations to arrest the suspect Van Kyan (priest) at large as early as possible.

- 17 single-shotguns, 84 assorted IEDs made up of PVC pipes and seven bulletproof vests hidden in four graves of RC cemetery by a priest affiliating with terrorists groups were found and confiscated.
