Chairman of State Administration Council Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing Met Mandalay Region Government and Discussed Development Tasks in the Region



Chairman of the State Administration Council (SAC) Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing met with members of Mandalay Region Government at the meeting hall of the regional government in Aungmyethazan township on 3 November

After hearing the reports, the chairman of the SAC highlighted the following points:

- As the areas of agriculture and livestock breeding tasks can be carried out successfully in Mandalay region, it is necessary to carry out advanced production industries in cooperation with the Ministry of Cooperatives and Rural Development in the townships under the city development committee and adjacent townships.
- It is necessary to produce value-added products by effectively making use of raw materials produced in respective areas in the region.
- It is required to take mass production into consideration in manufacturing agriculture and livestock breeding products extensively.

- Mandalay Region possesses favourable conditions for the production of fertilizer and it is necessary to carry out livestock breeding tasks systematically and to raise quality animal strains as the manure of chicken, cows and pigs, which are waste material from the industry, can be used as a natural fertilizer which can contribute to agricultural farms.
- It is necessary to produce natural fertilizer and EM Bokashi in rural areas under the leadership of the government in cooperation with responsible officials.
- In carrying out agriculture and livestock breeding tasks, it is important to boost yields by applying traditional methods and technologies.
- As it is necessary for Mandalay Region to boost the yield of cotton systematically to fulfil the cotton needs of the country, effort must be exerted as a model in cotton cultivation.
- It is necessary to take the construction of circular railroads and subway networks in the future in carrying out tasks for public transportation. If public transportation tasks can be implemented the use of private vehicles and motorcycles, reduce the consumption of fuel oil.
- There are about one million registered vehicles and six million registered motorcycles. It can be estimated how much fuel oil is consumed daily even if a vehicle uses only one bottle of fuel oil and a motorcycle consumes a tin of it. As fuel oil is imported by spending a large sum of foreign currency, efforts must be made to reduce the consumption of fuel oil.
- If it is possible to use renewable energy like solar energy in rural areas in Mandalay Region, this will help fulfil the electricity needs. The government and the Tatmadaw have been exerting efforts to produce solar plates.

The meeting was attended by the SAC members, Union Ministers, Mandalay region Chief Minister, ministers of regional government and officials.

Myanmar Investment Commission (MIC) Meeting Held



The Myanmar Investment Commission (MIC) meeting (5/2021) was held at the Union Government Office in Nay Pyi Taw on 3 November. The meeting was attended by State Administration Council member MIC Chairman and commission members.

- This is the first meeting of the 2021-2022 fiscal year (short term). During the meeting, the capitals of 19 ongoing investment projects were increased and 13 new businesses in the sectors of agricultural, and hostels and tourism, and the manufacturing and services were approved.
- The amount of investment of these businesses is US\$ 204.838 million and Kyats 225,520.015 million, which will create 2,972 jobs for local workers.
- According to the Myanmar Investment Promotion Plan, the amount of investment targeted for the last financial year

(2020-2021) was US\$5.8 billion, and there was the impact of the COVID-19 on the economy around the world, the amount of investment in Myanmar reached nearly US\$ 3.8 billion which was over 65 percent of the investment target.

- By the end of September 2021, among the countries with the largest investment out of 51 countries investing in Myanmar are Singapore, China, and Thailand and the sector are the electric power sector accounting for 28 percent, oil and gas sector accounting for 25.18 percent, and the manufacturing sector accounting for 14.26 percent.

A Coordination Meeting on Vaccinating Students from University, College/ Degree College against COVID-19 Held



A coordination meeting on vaccinating students from universities, college/ degree college against COVID-19 was held at the meeting hall of Ministry of Health on 3 November.

During the meeting, Union Minister for Health Dr. Thet Khaing Win stressed the following points:

- The vaccination process is an essentiality in the COVID-19 precautionary measures and plans are underway to vaccinate the students from universities, college/ degree college against COVID-19.
- Regarding the vaccinating process,

the students enrolled at the universities, college/ degree college will be prioritized and distance students starting to attend the short courses will also be administered.

- The Union Minister also discussed to conduct filling the bio-data of students from respective universities and colleges to the Vaccination Management Data System in time.

The meeting was attended by Union Minister Dr Thet Khaing Win, officials from Ministry of Health and departmental officials.

- Regarding the vaccinating process, the students enrolled at the universities, college/ degree college will be prioritized and distance students starting to attend the short courses will also be administered.

COVID-19 Prevention, Control, and Treatment Activities Continue in Respective Regions and States



In every state and region of Myanmar, Tatmadaw and departmental officials are accelerating the COVID-19 prevention, control and treatment activities such as, opening quarantine centres and vaccinating people against COVID-19.

- A total of 166 closed contacts (88 males and 78 females) are taking necessary treatments at Nay Pyi Taw Interrogation and Accommodation centre.
- The vaccination processes continue in respective regions and states. As per the priority programme, a total of 183,391 people have been vaccinated against COVID-19 as second doses and 107,499 people as first doses on 3 November.
- A total of 18,708 students aged 12 years and above from Basic Education Middle and High schools in respective regions and states have been vaccinated against COVID-19 on 3 November. A total of 1,024,357 students have been vaccinated

against COVID-19 up to 3 November.

- COVID-19 vaccines and syringes are being transported to Dawei township of Taninthayi region, Kale township of Sagaing region, Loikaw town of Kayah state, Kengtung township of Shan state (east), Lashio township of Shan State (north) and Myitkyina town of Kachin state by using Tatmadaw aircraft and motor vehicles as per cold-chain standards.

Measures are being taken to import COVID-19 control, containment and treatment medicines and related equipment-

- On 3 November, A total of 200 empty oxygen cylinders, one oxygen generator for clinical use, 30 oxygen concentrators for home use and nine tonnes of gloves, were imported via the Myawady trade zone and Yangon International Ports.

The Ministry of Health is conducting

COVID-19 tests regularly, 955 new cases of COVID-19 were found from testing a total of 28,739 samples and the infected rates are 3.32 percent on 3 November. Up to 3 November 2021, a total of 502,979 cases were

found from testing a total of 4,939,749 samples and death toll reached 18,744.

Terrorists Indiscriminately Killed a Village Administrator Who Conducted COVID-19 Prevention Awareness Activities in Thinpyo Village of Kyaukse Township

The State Administration Council government is accelerating COVID-19 control and precautionary measures. However, the so-called PDF terrorists manipulated by the terrorist group NUG are doing the terrorist acts of bombing COVID-19 vaccination sites, destroying the COVID-19 treatment hospitals and centres, and killing the volunteers and administrators participating in the COVID-19 control and preventative activities.

- In the evening of 1 November, the Thinpyo village administrator of Kyaukse township U Myint Thein Htay along with other responsible persons was doing COVID-19 awareness activity of urging the residents to conduct COVID-19 control and prevention activities using amplified-loudspeaker at the village administrative office. At that moment, two terrorists with a motorbike arrived there, killed him by shooting with a pistol for five times and drove away.

- As U Myint Thein Htay was seriously wounded at his chest and abdomen, he was promptly taken to the Public hospital of Kyaukse town and died of the injuries.
