


The Chairman of the State Administration Council (SAC) Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services Senior General Min Aung Hlaing held talks with Commander-in -Chief of the Royal Cambodian Armed Forces General VONG PISEN through videoconferencing on 8 December. The discussions in the meeting are as follows:

- The matters relating to full understanding of Cambodia to support the political progress in Myanmar and Rakhine issue.
- The conditions on full cooperation of Myanmar in respective sectors with Cambodia in serving the alternate chairmanship of ASEAN.
- The matters relating to the unity of ASEAN countries, needs of all ASEAN countries to abide by the ASEAN Charter, and possible impacts of violating ASEAN Charter by some ASEAN countries upon all member countries.
- The conditions on friendly relations and cooperation works under various sectors between the two countries and two

armed forces.

- The plans of medical teams from the Royal Cambodian Armed Forces visiting to Myanmar for cooperating in the prevention of COVID-19.
- The matters relating to cooperation in prevention of Omicron COVID-19 variant virus which occurs in some global countries.
- The invitation to the Chairman of the State Administration Council Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services and senior military officers to personally attend the 19th ASEAN Chiefs of Defence Forces' Meeting and ASEAN meetings to be held in coming March in Cambodia in addition to goodwill visits of two countries and the two armed forces.
- The plans to exchange the visits of naval vessels between the two navies of both countries. The Senior Genaral urged Cambodia in its term of ASEAN chairmanship to implement the common interests of ASEAN countries without at-

tachment in line with the ASEAN Charter.

The meeting was attended by the Chairman of the SAC, Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services together with Chief of Staff (Army) Lt-Gen Moe Myint Tun and Chief of Military Affairs Security Lt-Gen Ye Win Oo. The Commander-in-Chief of the Royal Cambodian Armed Forces accompanied by Chief of Research and Intelligence Department Lieutenant-General Hann Sovann from the Royal Cambodian Armed Forces, Myanmar Military Attaché (Army, Navy and Air) to Cambodia Brig-Gen Thura Hla Min and officials of the Royal Cambodian Armed Forces attended the meeting.

- The matters relating to the unity of ASEAN countries, needs of all ASEAN countries to abide by the ASEAN Charter, and possible impacts of violating ASEAN Charter by some ASEAN countries upon all member countries.
- The plans of medical teams from the Royal Cambodian Armed Forces visiting to Myanmar for cooperating in the prevention of COVID-19.
- The plans to exchange the visits of naval vessels between the two navies of both countries.
- The Senior Genaral urged Cambodia in its term of ASEAN chairmanship to implement the common interests of ASEAN countries without attachment in line with the ASEAN Charter.

Chairman of State Administration Council Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing Inspected Preservation of Ancient Tatmadaw Guesthouses in Pyin Oo Lwin Station, Breeding of Dairy Cows and Production of Dairy Products

Chairman of the State Administration Council (SAC) Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing, accompanied by members and Joint Secretary of SAC, Union Ministers and officials, inspected the maintenance work of ancient Tatmadaw guesthouses in Pyin Oo Lwin station, breeding of dairy cows and production of dairy products on 8 December.

The Chairman of the SAC Prime Minister and party inspected the maintenance works of ancient Tatmadaw guesthouses: Thazin Myaing, Cherry Myaing and Yuzana Myaing. The Prime Minister instructed the officials to systematically preserve the guesthouses in their original design as they are antique buildings and use only the furniture and other utilities of ancient designs to the most possible degree in the preservation work.

Afterwards, the Prime Minister and party visited the dairy cow breeding and

dairy product industry in Htonbo village, the Sham cream production industry in Nawngkhamgyi village and the Parami cream shop near the Purcell tower. The Prime Minister met with the cow breeding and cream making entrepreneurs as follows:

- Myanmar imports dairy products worth US\$50 million per year. Dairy cows are bred systematically with sound foundations for the production of dairy products in the country so as to save spending on foreign exchange.
- If breeding and feeding are systematically carried out, Pyin Oo Lwin will be prosperous region.
- It is necessary to take measures to produce quality cream, pack the products properly and distribute them to the entire country.
- The government assists in the production of value-added foodstuffs using dairy

products and crops produced by local, and in the implementation of the smalland medium-scale enterprises (SME) as much as possible.

• The entrepreneurs need to systematically raise dairy cattle in Pyin Oo Lwin as the public can consume dairy foodstuff nutritionally by producing dairy products like milk, yoghurt and cream in the country.

After the Chairman of the SAC Prime Minister hearing the reports of the entrepreneurs, he coordinated the requirements to fulfil their needs.



A meeting of the selection committee for presenting honorary titles and medals for 2022 was held at Areindmar Hall of Office No (8), Nay Pyi Taw on 8 December. - The report of the 'religious title offering scrutiny committee' will be submitted to the meeting of the Union government to offer the titles to members of the Sangha, nuns and laypeople in 2022.

The Vice-Senior General stressed the need to confer the titles and medals to the deserved persons including Sangha, nuns, Tatmadaw members, Myanmar Police Force members and civil service personnel without leaving anyone behind. It is also important to ensure the title recipients must have deserved performance for their prosperities so that their descendants can be proud of them.




eration and future collaboration under the ASEAN framework on the basis of ASEAN family spirit and ASEAN solidarity.

The Union minister for Natural Resources and Environmental Conservation U Khin Maung Yee and senior officials and ministers for environmental-conservationrelated ministries and senior officials of Mekong Sub-Region countries of Cambodia, Lao, Thailand, and Vietnam, as well as representatives of ASEAN Secretariat and ASEAN Specialized Meteorological Centre joined the event. During the meeting, the Union minister U Khin Maung Yee stressed the following points:

 Although the Mekong region is rich in various ecosystems such as forests, native plants and animals, minerals, wetlands and marine resources, regional cooperation is now important to prevent any possible challenge and threats to them.

- Particularly, wildfire and transboundary haze pollution are the regional environmental challenge to be resolved urgently by the ASEAN countries, including the countries of Mekong regions.
- Myanmar has been implementing the national level haze pollution management agenda.
- Myanmar will closely cooperate with Mekong Sub-Region countries in implementing the pledges to reduce the transboundary haze pollution.

China's CITIC Group and Myanmar Rice Federation Inked a Memorandum of Agreement (MoA)



The virtual signing ceremony of the Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) between CITIC Group of the People's Republic of China and the Myanmar Rice Federation was held at the meeting hall of the Ministry of Commerce on 8 December.

At the ceremony, Union minister for Commerce Dr Pwint San stressed the following points:

- He believed that it would be better to include a short-term and immediately beneficial trade component in this MoA, in addition to the long-term investments in the agricultural sector.
- According to MoA, the Ministry strongly encourages the trade in rice, broken rice, maize and fertilizers by bilateral negotiations.
- As Myanmar is an agro-based country, it is very important to export quality agricultural products such as rice, maize and assorted beans and to gain a stable mar-

ket.

• It is believed that the China-Myanmar friendship can be further enhanced through agricultural cooperation.

It is important to improve regional food adequacy, food security and economic opportunities for farmers as well as rural development, connecting with China's Belt and Road Initiative.

The two sides signed the MoA which was upgraded from MoU to expand cooperation for agricultural products and exchanged it.

COVID-19 Prevention, Control, and Treatment Activities Continue in Respective Regions and States

COVID-19 prevention, control and treatment activities such as opening quarantine centres and vaccinating people against COVID-19 continue in respective regions and states.

- The vaccination processes continue in respective regions and states as per the priority programme, and a total of 113,240 people have been vaccinated against COVID-19 as second dose and 175,924 people as first dose on 8 December.
- A total of 26,145 students aged 12 years and above from Basic Education Middle and High schools in respective regions and states have been vaccinated against COVID-19 as second dose and 4,510 students as first dose on 8 December. A total of 1,376,667 students have been vaccinated against COVID-19 up to 8

December.

• As of 8 December, 18.18 million people in total have been vaccinated against COVID-19. About 12.58 million people have been received two-time full doses of the vaccine and 5.6 million people have received the first doses. 30.7 million people in total have been inoculated against COVID-19 in Myanmar.

Measures are being taken to facilitate the import of COVID-19 control, containment and treatment medicines and related equipment-

 On 8 December, a total of 77 tonnes of liquid oxygen carried by four bowsers and 74 tons of masks were imported by seven companies using fourteen vehicles via Muse 105th Mile and Myawady trade zones and Chinshwehaw border trade

Entire Ethnic People Requested to Vigorously Participate in the Prevention of Further Terrorist Acts of Terrorists over Religious Affairs

After terrorist groups so-called CRPH and NUG have declared to accelerate acts of violence in Myanmar on 7 September, they have been committing bombing and arson attacks on civilian targets which are not military targets, and assassinations on innocent civilians in some areas, in addition to abductions and killings on Sangha paid homage by the people without being consideration. Due to their acts of terrorism to religious affairs, a total of 14 Sangha have passed away, and those terrorists burnt down and committed terrorist attacks on the monasteries in some areas.

On 6 December, Presiding Abbot of the Lonpi Sasana Rekkhita Pariyatti Missionary Monastery of Falam township in Chin State, Chairman of the Township Sangha Nayaka Committee Bhaddanta Nyanika returned to the monastery by a vehicle driven by deputy staff officer of the School U Chit San of the Falam township Youth Training School. On the way, they were abducted by so-called PDF terrorists. On 8 December, the Sayadaw arrived back in Falam township and deputy staff officer U Chit San was missing due to the abduction of the terrorists.

Similarly, three members of the Sangha led by Abbot of Lumbini Monastery in Myoma ward No (14) of Tamu township of Sagaing region Sayadaw Bhaddanta Vayama and one layperson returned from the donation ceremony in Hleseik village by the monastery owned vehicle. When they arrived near Chaungenergy village, socalled PDF terrorists opened fire at the vehicle without any reason, and the vehicle was damaged in the incident.

Moreover, terrorists attempted to set fire to Hilly Missionary Sayadaw Bhaddanta Paññajota residing in Mindat township of Chin State together with the vehicle on the afternoon of 12 June.



Anyone should not commit terror acts on religious affairs. It is reported that any organization in Myanmar that repeats any acts of terrorism against religion, including threatening, arrests and killings related to religious matters, are strongly warned. Therefore, the entire ethnic people are urged to cooperate with security forces in order to prevent any recurrence of such acts of violence against religion.

The MHG terrorist group members who committed bombing attacks and violent acts in Monywa township: Thiha (aka) Thiha Aung, 30, Ei Tone, 19 and Thet Hnine Ko Ko, 22 were arrested in Bone Soe ward of Monywa township along with one Bretta pistol, one homemade pistol, two pistol magazines, 10 rounds of 9 mm bullet, two homemade bombs, and four homemade gun barrels made of iron pipe. This news report was already described on 27 November.

According to the confessions and interrogation results of the arrested offenders:

- Htoo Thant Lwin (aka) Moe Kyoe, 19, a resident of of Nandawun ward, Aung Zeya, 19, a resident of Attawywarpyin ward and Htike Zaw Aung, 18, a resident of Nandawun ward of Monywa township were arrested on 3 December.
- Security forces also arrested Putspadawi, 58, the owner and Aung Kyaw Myint, 27, manager of the HONEY guesthouse located in Nandawun ward where the above-mentioned arrested offenders temporarily stayed.

- In the above-mentioned incident, 8 offenders in total were arrested along with three pistols, two magazines, 10 rounds of bullet and two homemade bombs.
- The offender Thet Hnine Ko Ko has attended the explosion trainings near Tharzi village of Monywa township and at KIA training school near Mawgadae village.
- Regarding the weapons and ammunitions, four males (under investigation) including Maung Kyaw living in Myawady town contacted by Thiha (aka) Thiha Aung came to Aung Zeya's home and provided two Glock pistols and one Bretta pistol to Htoo Thant Lwin, Htike Zaw Aung and Myint Maung Maung (at large).

According to the confessions of the arrested offenders, they assassinated innocent civilians for six times after accusing them as 'informant/dalan' based on personal hatreds as follows:

• On 2 August, Ei Tone and Thet Hnine Ko Ko shot and killed an innocent civil-

ian living in Nandawun ward of Monywa township.

- On 2 August, Htoo Thant Lwin, Ei Tone and Kaung Su Tha (at large) stabbed and killed an innocent civilian male living in Pauktaw ward of Monywa township.
- On 1 October, Ei Tone and Thet Hnine Ko Ko shot and killed an innocent civilian woman living in Pyidawtha ward of Monywa township.
- On 5 October, Ei Tone, Thet Hnine Ko Ko and Kaung Su Tha (at large) with pistol, shot and killed an innocent civilian male living in Thitsaint village of Monywa township.
- On 8 October, Htoo Thant Lwin, Ei Tone and Thet Hnine Ko Ko shot and killed an innocent civilian male living in Innywarthit ward of Monywa township.
- On 9 October, Htoo Thant Lwin and Thet Hnine Ko Ko shot and killed an innocent civilian male living in Kyayhmon Kwatthit village of Monywa township.
- Regarding the above-mentioned assassinations, it found that the extreme NLD party hardcore Htoo Thant Lwin and Kaung Su Tha (at large) provided guns and ammunitions as well as cash assistance to conduct such violent acts while Ei Tone and Thet Hnine Ko Ko scouted the routes and committed the murders

themselves.

The arrested offenders conducted four times of bombing attacks in Monywa town-ship:

- The team led by Thein Naing Win (aka) Bo Thein (at large) exploded an IED in front of TTC institute located on Tharzi street of Monywa township on 29 August.
- Htoo Thant Lwin, Aung Zeya, Thet Hnine Ko Ko and Kaung Su Tha (at large) exploded a bomb near the township irrigation department in Thanla ward of Monywa township on 5 September.
- Htoo Thant Lwin, and Kaung Su Tha (at large) exploded a bomb in an old jeep in front of the Than Gaday Aung gasstation near Monywa University on 9 September.
- Tun Tun Win (aka) Ange Lay made explosions near the signboard, 'We Love Monywa' located on Bogyoke street, Kantha ward of Monywa township on 15 September.
- With the arrangement of Kaung Su Tha (at large), Htoo Thant Lwin (aka) Moe Kyoe, Aung Zeya and Htike Zaw Aung committed terrorist acts by using the HONEY guesthouse as a safe haven.
- According to the confessions of the ar-

rested offenders, they were instructed to commit brutal killings and violent bombings by the Monywa PDF terrorist group members of extreme NLD hardcore supporters Kaung Su Tha, Thein Naing Win (aka) Bo Thein, Myint Maung Maung and Aung Phyo Wai (aka) Sayar Kyaung who are still at large.

The terrorist groups CRPH, NUG and PDF, with the intents to disrupt the State's administrative mechanism and create public panic, are killing civil servant personal innocent civilians after accusing them as informants and also conducting bombing attacks at the public places. The people who want to live in peaceful environment are disgusted with the anarchic and lawless activities of the PDF terrorists and therefore, the terrorists were arrested due to the information tips of the formers.

Necessary measures will continue to take punitive legal actions against the 8 arrested offenders. People have been requested to report nearest authorities about the information on the hideouts and movements of the terrorists in order to arrest them as early as possible and moreover, the entire public participation has been called for to restore the community peace and stability.

The Chart Showing the Relation of the Arrest of Members of "SRAF" Terrorist Group Committing Acts of Terrorism in Monywa Township



MoEE Ex-Union minister U Win Khaing, Ex-deputy ministers Dr Tun Naing, U Khin Maung Win Charged under Anti-Corruption Law

The Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) set up an investigation team regarding the complaint against the ex-Union Minister for Electricity and Energy U Win Khaing and other officials' engagement in corruption.

According to the investigation team,

- Ex-Union Minister for Electricity and Energy U Win Khaing and ex-Deputy Minister Dr Tun Naing extended the duration for another 16 months till 24 January 2020 with the decisions of MC and EC meetings although the period of deadline in original agreement was set for 40 months till 24 September 2018 in making an agreement to conduct underground works of the upper Yeywa Hydropower project undertaken by the Department of Hydropower Implementation with an international company on 12 March 2015.
- Ex-Union Minister and ex-Deputy Minister Dr Tun Naing did not follow procedures in making such extension of agreement that made more than K30 billion lost to the Union finance as it could not produce more than 1,800 kilowatt-hours (unit).
- MoEE ex-Union Minister and the ex-Deputy Minister Dr Tun Naing permitted to spend in advance more than K6 billion under the budget of the Department of Electric Power Engineering for gas procurement of the GGS company, which was controlled by Taninthayi Region Government in Dawei region, without seeking permission of the Union government.

- Ex-Deputy Minister U Khin Maung Win submitted more than K6 billion of to the Union budget for gas fee and spent it while he was serving as the Managing Director of Department of Electric Power Engineering. But he also did not submit the significant gas debt amount to EC meeting that made more than K6 billion lost to the Union finance.
- Ex-Deputy Minister U Khin Maung Win assisted the ex-Union Minister's act of losing to the State finance while he was serving as managing director.

According to confessions, lawsuits have been filed against ex-Union Minister for Electricity and Energy U Win Khaing and ex-Deputy Minister Dr Tun Naing under Section 55 of the Anti-Corruption Law, and Ex-Deputy Minister U Khin Maung Win under Section 55/63 of the Anti-Corruption Law at the Phayagon Myoma Police Station in Nay Pyi Taw on 8 December.
