Public Notification on Repair Works as Transmission Lines to National Grid Destroyed



Public Notification on Repair Works as Transmission Lines to National Grid Destroyed

As the so-called CRPH, NUG and PDF terrorist groups repeatedly committed bombing attacks to the power pylons and towers connecting from Biluchaung Hydropower Plant, the Ministry of Electricity and Energy released a public notification stating that the repair works are underway to recover the damaged towers as soon as possible, and the lower electricity production rate will be accordingly conducted during the periods of the high power consumption.

Public Notification

1. The Ministry of Electricity and Energy has released "Public request regarding the declining power generation capacity of large power plants in the national grid," on 5 January 2022, requesting the public to understand the inconvenience of reducing the normal load capacity, which is about 1,470 megawatts, in some areas. The request also stated that the Ministry is working on new projects to meet the electricity demand as soon as possible.

2. Although about 540 megawatts can be generated from gas fired power plants as maintenance work on the Yadana Offshore project has already been completed, 230 kV Biluchaung (2) - Shwe Myo Power Line, which was destroyed for the fourth time on 3 January 2022, and the 230 kV Biluchaung (2) - Taungoo power line, which was destroyed for the fourth time on 18 December 2021, are being repaired under security. At 9:20 pm on 9 January 2022, 132 kV Biluchaung (2) - Tikyit Power Line was destroyed for the second time, and about 220 megawatts of electricity from Biluchaung Hydropower Plant could not be sent to the National Grid. In addition, due to rising gas prices, about 750 megawatts of LNG power plants have been shut down, for a total of about 970 megawatts, which will continue to be reduced and load balancing will have to continue.

3. Therefore, according to the load adjustment for the reduced power generation of about 970 MW, load reduction will continue between 07:00 am and 11:00 am and from 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm, which is a time of high-power consumption. The public is requested to understand if there is any inconvenience and that the Ministry is working to repair the damaged

towers as soon as possible, as well as new projects are being made to supply the required electricity as soon as possible.

- As the maintenance work on the Yadana Offshore project has already been completed, about 540 megawatts can be generated from gas fired power plants.

Press Release on Detection of SARS-CoV-2 Variant Omicron in Persons Returned from India by Relief Flights



Three Persons who had Tested Positive for Omicron Returned from India by the Relief flights

Ministry of Health released a statement on 9 January that among the returnees from India by Relief Flight, three laboratory samples of the COVID-19 infected people have tested positive for SARS-CoV-2 Variant Omicron.

Statement

Detection of SARS-CoV-2 Variant Omicron in Three Persons Returned from India by Relief Flight

11 January 2022

1. The Ministry of Health is continuously conducting "COVID-19 Molecular Disease Surveillance". The Ministry released a statement on the detection of SARS CoV-2 Variant Omicron in persons returned by relief flights in a timely manner.

2. The four laboratory samples of the COVID-19 virus of the returnees were sent to the National Health Laboratory and No (1) Defence Services General Hospital (1000-bed) on 9-1-2022 and the SARS-CoV-2 Variant Omicron was found in three laboratory samples.

3. Three Myanmar nationals who had tested positive for Omicron returned from India by the relief flight.

4. The patients are admitted to the designated hospitals for medical treatment and the passengers who returned together with them now undergo Strict Quarantine and lab tests.

5. Therefore, it is announced that the Ministry is stepping up the COVID-19 disease monitoring and control activities plus disease prevention, control and treatment activities.

People's Republic of China Donates One Million Doses of Sinovac Vaccine to Myanmar for Five Townships at Myanmar-China Border



746,800 doses of Sinovac, as a first batch out of one million vaccines donated by the People's Republic of China for five townships on Myanmar-China border in Myanmar have already been delivered to the border townships of Yunan province along the border area between China and Myanmar.

- Delivery of 253,200 doses of Sinovac vaccines, as a second batch, will be started from Beijing city on 9 February and completely transported to Myanmar by 10 March.
- As those one million covid-19 vaccines will be used in Shan and Kachin states sharing borders with China, the Embassy of China released a statement stating that the vaccines are crucial to enhance the capability of fighting against COVID -19 pandemic in the northern Myanmar, to secure the people of both countries

from the pandemic and to reinforce the healthcare services in the area.

It is reported that Myanmar has purchased 29.7 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines from China and received a donation of 10.3 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines from China after COVID-19 pandemic broke out.

The Ministry of Health has received a total of 45.1 million of COVID-19 vaccines purchased from abroad (15.4 million doses of Covishield, 26.7 million doses of Sinovac) and a total of 15 million doses of Sinovac) and a total of 15 million doses as donations (2.5 million doses of Covishield, 3.6 million doses of Sinovac, 2.2 million doses of Covaxin and 1,700 doses of Sputnik-V), totaling 60.1 million doses.

Press Release on Arrests of Terrorists near Mohso Village, Hpruso Township, Kayah State

A press release was issued that the terrorists and their affiliations are spreading fabricated news about the incident on social network pages to cause misunderstanding between Tatmadaw and local border guards as well as some organizations and the media and some individuals supporting violence are publishing news based on their own perspectives without understanding the truth. Continuously, the members of security forces are strictly following the Rules of Engagement (ROE).

When a passenger plane from Myanmar National Airways landed at the airport in Loikaw, Kayah State, on 24 December 2021 morning, a combined group, comprising KNPP members and so-called PDF terrorists, shot with 107 mm rockets and fled after dashing into the wards by cars and using residential people as cover.

Soon after the incident occurred, security forces blocked and checked all the possible escape routes to capture assailants. Security forces discharging duties near Mohso village, Hpruso township, found a row of seven cars to travelling from Koi Ngan old village to Mohso village. When security members tried to stop the cars for investigation, the assailants fired small firearms at them and drove away. During the chase, security forces fired back at terrorists who fired heavy and small weapons at them from the hills located near Mohso village. During the shootout, security forces arrested some KNPP members and so-called PDF terrorists, and some recruits who were going to attend terrorism course dead. Seven cars that were carrying fuel, diesel and food extorted from villagers caught fire. News about the incident has already been released.

But, organizations and the media that advocate terrorism and some individuals were spreading fabricated news about the incident on social network pages to cause misunderstanding between Tatmadaw and local border guards. Hence, the Commander of Eastern Command, the director of Directorate of People's Militia and Border Guard Force and party looked into the matter together with officials of local border guard force.

According to the inquiry, when security forces conducting security measures near Mohso village tried to stop the seven suspicious cars rolling along the illegally built Demoso-Koi Ngan old village-Dawtkayahkhu-Mohso ground road, a shootout occurred when the assailants fired small arms without stopping their cars and terrorists taking positions in advance on the hills near Mohso village attacked with heavy and small weapons. During the shootout, the leading car that was carrying fuel caught in the crossfire and turned into a fireball when hit by small arm fire and bomb shells. Then, fire quickly spread to the remaining vehicles. Although security forces did their best to rescue the persons inside the burning cars amidst the whizzing bullets, they were not successful because of the size of fire and enemy fire. Continuously, the security members asked help from the nearest fire brigades but firemen count not come to the scene as their fire engines were destroyed by terrorists and their manpower dropped because of including CDM activities.

The public road from Demoso to Mohso village is via Demoso-Hpruso tar road. The incident reached the current condition as the terrorists covertly drove along the illegal Demoso-Koi Ngan old village-Dawtkayahkhu-Mohso ground road. It was found that while members of security forces and terrorists were engaging in a clash, residents from Mohso village asked for help from the Border Guard Post and four members of the Border Guard Post went to the place of clash wearing civilian clothes with small arms without reporting to responsible officials, that sounds of small arms were heard after the group left the post and the clash had already begun before the group left the post and that they, therefore, were likely to encounter with terrorists called the KNPP and the PDF and were killed by them before being tied their hands in their back to fabricate that they were tortured to death by security forces. It was also found that some organizations and the media and some individuals supporting violence repeatedly created doubts between the Tatmadaw and Border Guard Force on social media pages without understanding the truth. On the ground, security forces even tried to put out the fire in a timely manner but were unable to do so due to shootings of the KNPP and so-called PDF terrorists on the hills, leading to the deaths of the KNPP and so-called PDF terrorists and passengers on the vehicles.

It was also published in State-owned newspaper and on State-owned television channels that a fire incident involving the loss of a vehicle due to the explosion of gasoline and diesel took place in Tamwe township in Yangon region on 18 June 2021 when a homemade bomb of terrorists hit the fuel tank of the patrol car of security forces and the car caught fire, killing and injuring member of security forces on the car.

Looking into the two incidents, it can be seen that vehicles can be damaged if they are attacked with heavy weapons, small arms and homemade bombs while carrying combustible fuels and foodstuffs and that terrorists and individuals supporting them are fabricating news and posting incitements by taking advantages of such incidents to accuse that the Tatmadaw, security forces and border guard force are killing civilians. Moreover, some organizations, the media and individuals are publishing news based on their own perspectives without understanding the truth. It was revealed that terrorists called the KNPP and the PDF killed members of border guard forces and tied their hands in their back before setting them on fire after their vehicles were damaged by fire during the incident that took place near Mohso village to intentionally and purposefully create doubts.

Members of security forces strictly followed the Rules of Engagement (ROE) by giving priority to prevent collateral damage in accordance with international conventions and the public is urged to distinguish between right and wrong by analyzing fabricated and onesided reports.

- Regarding the incident of seven damaged vehicle in fire that were spreading on social network, due to the shootout between security force members and terrorist groups, the leading car that was carrying fuel caught in the crossfire and turned into a fireball when hit by small arm fire and bomb shells. Then, fire quickly spread to the remaining vehicles. Although security forces did their best to rescue the persons inside the burning cars amidst the whizzing bullets, they were not successful because of the size of fire and enemy fire.

- On the ground, security forces even tried to put out the fire in a timely manner but were unable to do so due to shootings of the KNPP and so-called PDF terrorists on the hills, leading to the deaths of the KNPP and so-called PDF terrorists and passengers on the vehicles.
- It can be seen that vehicles can be damaged if they are attacked with heavy weapons, small arms and homemade bombs while carrying combustible fuels and foodstuffs and that terrorists and individuals supporting them are fabricating news and posting incitements by taking advantages of such incidents to accuse that the Tatmadaw, security forces and border guard force are killing civilians.

So-Called PDF Terrorists Violently Threatening and Killing Teachers

Under the instructions of NUG with the aim of utter devastation, terrorists are blowing up the education offices and schools using IEDs and grenades, and also committing the crimes of threatening and killing teachers as well as robbing and extorting money from them.

An elementary school teacher called Daw Hla Hla Nyunt, 48 from BEHS (Padee) of Taze township of Sagaing Region and her husband U Aung Zaw Moe, 53 were brutally shot to death by PDF terrorists on 8 January. While the couple were at home, eight PDF terrorists abducted them for not joining CDM and shot them dead near the Pay Chaung village.

The Basic Education Post-Primary School in Latpanzin village and the Basic Education High School from Kyauktonegyi village in Katha township were reopened on 9 November.

• On 10 January, four so-called PDF terrorists with two motorbikes holding guns entered the Basic Education Post-Primary School in Latpanzin village. The terrorists then broke into the teachers' resting room and threatened them 'not to open the school and if they do, the lives of the teachers and students will not be guaranteed and they will torch and destroy the school'. The terrorists then took the mobile phones of the teachers and left.

- The four terrorists also entered the campus of the BEHS in Kyauktonegyi village and took the mobile phones of the teachers living in the school. They also severely hit and beat the teachers after threatening the latter not to open the school leaving some injured.
- A terrorist also reportedly made a phone call to the headmistress of a sub-BESH in Daunggyi village and made a similar threat.

The PDF terrorists and extreme supporters of NLD party are committing terrorist attacks targeting against the education infrastructures, students and teachers to disrupt the peaceful learning of students for their future. The entire population want the international communities to denounce the terrorists doing such nefarious acts.

The local security forces are joining hands together with people to ensure the peaceful learning of students and to arrest the terrorists who do want to break down the education sector of the country.

A School Principal in Apaw Village of Sidoktaya Township Abducted by Terrorists and Demanded a Ransom of K10 Million

U Thet Naung Tun, 31, a school principal of the Basic Education Sub-High School in Apaw village of Sidoktaya township in Magway region, was abducted by so -called PDF terrorists on 9 January. In the incident, while he was tutoring schoolchildren at his home in the schoolyard, about 40 so-called PDF terrorists from Kanpatlet township came to his home and abducted him to a forest to the west of the village, accusing him that he has opened the school without joining the CDM and demanding a ransom of K10 million from the villagers to save his life.

With the lead of village elders, the villagers contributed to a money collection of K3million to save the life of the principal who have been teaching the children in the village. It is reported that they, then, negotiated with terrorists to release him from captivity, giving K3 million to the terrorists.

During his captivity, terrorists threatened the principal to stop opening the school and join the CDM campaign as well. Moreover, the terrorists inhumanely made the principle barbaric tortures, including cutting his hair in 'four locks' and piercing his ears to damage his dignity and shame.

Terrorists are now committing further acts of robbery to school teachers in addition to the killings of them who are parts of the Five Infinite Venerables. It is reported that people and civil servants getting bullied by terrorists, consequently, could no longer tolerate the their violence and come to object to their acts.

Security forces are carrying out further necessary measures in line with the security processes to uncover and arrest terrorists, working together with local military columns.

In the morning of 10 January, five males including U Hlwan Moe and a female from Ngwedwin village, Ayadaw Township went to Mandalay by a light truck vehicle driven by Arkar Min, to sell betel leaves. At around 5:30 pm, on their way back home near the locally-known Tawat Magyibin bridge between Shwepangon village and Thamayoe village, PDF terrorists reportedly detonated a local-made landmine and stopped the car.

The terrorists then forced the villag-

ers to get off the vehicle and shot them. After that, they took K10 million from the sales of betel leaves and left. Four males and a female on the vehicle were killed in the incident and the driver the driver Arka Min got gun-shot wounds on his left arm and forearm

It is reported that death cases were opened for the deceased ones in the incident and necessary investigations are underway so that action will be taken against those who are involved in the crime under the law.

PDF Armed Terrorists Attack a Truck Carrying Argon Gas

The PDF terrorists opened fire at the truck that carried Argon Gas from Myawady of Kayin State to Mandalay on 11 January. The truck carrying 19 tonnes of Argon Gas was driven by U Tun Min Oo, accompanied by Ye Htoo Aung was attacked by the PDF terrorists when it arrived at about three kilometres from Tatangu Village of Kawkareik Township. The windshield and the wheels of the truck were damaged in the attack.

The media outlets opposing the State's government are releasing fake news

and fabrications stating that the trucks carrying industrial-used gasolines and medical oxygen supplies are transporting aviation fuel of the Tatmadaw. Therefore, the PDF terrorist groups are attacking the trucks on their way resulting in damages to the private business owners.

Security forces continue necessary measures to arrest these terrorists as quickly as possible and to improve the area security.

Conscientious People Honoured with Cash Awards and Food Items for Contributing to the Capture of Terrorists who Attacked a Shop Selling Electric Items and a Grocery Store

In Kyaungkon township of Ayeyarwady region, two terrorists riding motorbikes threw grenades to a shop selling electric items and a grocery store located on the Yangon-Pathein road and attempted to flee. However, due to the combined efforts of security forces and conscientious people, the terrorists were arrested along with a pistol, two magazines, six rounds of 9 mm bullet and a grenade.

On 11 January, Ayeyarwady region Chief Minister, Commander of Southwest Command and officials met the conscientious people who contributed their efforts to the capture of terrorists in the abovementioned incident and provided cash awards and food items to them.
