Chairman of State Administration Council Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing Meets with Cabinet Members of Taninthayi Region Government, District and Township Level Departmental Officials and Town Elders



The Chairman of the State Administration Council (SAC) Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing met with cabinet members of Taninthayi Region Government, district and township level departmental officials and town elders at the meeting hall of the regional government office in Dawei township on 13 January.

During the meeting, the Chairman of the SAC stressed the following points:

- As there were voting frauds in the 2020 election, an emergency was declared and political changes took place. Although the Tatmadaw requested responsible officials to deal with the incorrect voting lists, they failed to address the matter.
- Suspicious election results were found when the election results were announced. There were 340,000 voting lists that could lead to voting frauds in Taninthayi region alone. Among them, there were 708 persons aged over 100

years in the voting lists.

- Although the enormous discrepancies were reported to the responsible officials repeatedly, they failed to handle the issue and attempted to seize the State power. So, the Tatmadaw had to declare emergency and state responsibilities.
- We did not seize the State power and it serves the duties under the Constitution (2008) as part of maintaining the strengthening of multiparty democracy.
- Regarding the COVID-19 pandemic, the COVID-19 prevention activities are very important, and the government strived for overcoming the third wave of the pandemic in July and August amid various difficulties.
- The government connected with various countries for taking vaccines and vaccinating the people accounting for more than 50 percent till the end of December.
- Regarding the peace process, this year

sees the Diamond Jubilee of Union Day while 4 January 2023 will be the Diamond Jubilee of Independence Day. So, this year is the eve of Diamond Jubilee of Independence Day. When we march towards the road to multi-party democracy, every citizen must enjoy equal rights without any difference.

- Hence, efforts are being made for the restoration of peace in 2022 by holding peace talks. The government is striving for holding informal meetings to enable the non-NCA signatories to participate in the peace talks.
- Regarding the health sector, our country needs the consumption of nutritious food and activities to stay fit and healthy. As Taninthayi region can choose to eat various kinds of fish and get meat and vegetables, people need to eat them fully and nutritiously to improve the health sector.
- With regard to the education sector, education must be encouraged to improve the country's education standard. Students must be taught to be really educated.
- Fishery-based industries need to be successful in Taninthayi region for economic development. It is necessary to ensure

- the improvement of the socio-economic status of local people based on rich national resources and prime location.
- As Taninthayi region is originally rich in national resources, it is a region having many potential for the future. It is suggested to encourage education and needed to encourage efforts for the emergence of systematic businesses. With the leadership of the government, supervision of departmental officials concerned at region and township levels and cooperation of local people, efforts are to be made to achieve success in regional development tasks.

### Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing inspected development tasks in Dawei Township

The Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing and party inspected Dawei University and the officials of the University reported on the matters relating

to the developments of the University. After hearing the reports, the Prime Minister stressed the following points:

- The State has already opened schools and universities to develop human resources. So, cooperation of students and parents is required to produce intellectuals and intelligentsia through education promotion.
- University teachers must encourage students' interest in actually acquiring academic and technical knowledge. University learning should not be by rote but it must be a study system through interactive learning and discussions between teachers and students. Students need to be arranged to read relevant subjects for having higher learning.
- Since the country is implementing the market-oriented economic system, it needs to disseminate economics and law.
   All universities need to give economic subjects and law subjects to students.

Then, the Prime Minister and party inspected the Kahmyawkin Bridge Construction Project, and Union Minister for Construction reported on the construction progress of bridges above 180 feet long in the Taninthayi region.

After hearing the reports, the Prime Minister stressed the following points:

- It is required to systematically carry out land preparations for the construction of the roads for long term existence as the region has high rainfalls. The roads are mainly damaged by rain and it is important to build proper drainage systems and to cover roads with tree branches to allow least amount of rain hits the road. Moreover, it is necessary to properly designate road areas and carry out maintenance tasks for road shoulders.
- As there are some six million motorcycles across the nation, it is necessary to pave the way for motorcycles. In the construction of bridges, it is important to systematically build them in accordance with their standards for their strength and durability.

State Administration Council Chairman Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing inspected Taungdagon oil palm cultivation project in Bokpyin Township on 14 January and stressed the following points responding to the reports of officials:

- Relevant ministry needs to soonest scrutinize and report back the actual utilization of cultivable lands or not under the farmland policies and the farmland laws.
- It is required to choose the quality strains of oil palm plants and the plantations must have fertile soil and sufficient water supply in the correct agricultural techniques for having high per-acre yield.
- Due to high consumption of edible oil in the country, a large volume of oil is imported on a yearly basis. In 2020-2021 financial year, cooking oil worth more than US\$-800 million spent by the State.
- According to the calculation of experts, individual person needs 1.58 ticals of oil per day and each person needs to consume some six visses of oil per year. On the other hand, efforts are being made to reduce oil consumption and increase the oil production through cultivation with

- the aim of having individual healthy life and reducing the spending of foreign exchange for the State.
- In order to reduce the import volume of palm oil, the businesspersons engaging in production of palm oil need to strive for further production of oil.
- It is required to cultivate oil palm plants cent percent in Kawthoung and Bokpyin regions.

• As the site for the construction of the fish auction market and industrial zone were chosen and granted in his trip to Myeik in 2021 and were allowed implementation of the projects, the priority to construct the fish auction market must be given first.

- Fishery products must be produced as value-added products at home for export purposes and the government is making an arrangement to generate hydropower for sufficient electrification in Myeik.
- Efforts must be made to generate electricity through solar power; to efficiently utilize the advantages of environment

- endowed by the nature to have high production of livestock breeding tasks; and to modernize the Myeik port to the international level one.
- As iron ore, coal and limestone are present in Tanintharyi region, local businesspersons need to operate other industries in addition to the fishery.

The Myanmar Investment Com- mission (MIC) held its meeting (1/2022) at No. 18 Union Government Office in Nay Pyi Taw on 14 January. Lt-Gen Moe Myint Tun, Chairman of the Myanmar Investment Commission-MIC and the MIC members attended. During the meeting:

- MIC green-lighted the expansion of capital by five existing enterprises and ten new projects in livestock and fishery, manufacturing, mining and services sectors.
- The overall investments amounted to US\$241.79 million and over K806 billion. Those enterprises will employ 2,646 residents.
- Myanmar has attracted foreign direct investment of more than \$479.395 million from 19 enterprises as of mid-January 2022 since October 2021. The domestic investments made by Myanmar citizens have exceeded K1,048 billion and 20 enterprises were given the green light. Those enterprises are to create 12,747 job opportunities.

During 2020-2021 FY, the domestic investments made by Myanmar citizens have reached US3.552 billion and K332.966 bil-

lion. During 2020-2021 FY, there included the projects in the fields of electricity, transport and communication, industry, construction, hotels and tourism, building industrial zones, livestock and fishery, agriculture and others in the direct foreign investments and domestic investments also included projects in the fields of mechanical, construction, other services, hotels and tourism, agriculture, electricity, and mineral excavation, transport and communication, livestock and fishery.

#### **COVID-19 Omicron Variant Prevention and Control Activities Accelerated**



Union Minister for Health meeting with COVID-19 Control and Emergency Response Committee and discussing the matters relating to COVID-19 Omicron Variant Prevention and Control Activities

The Ministry of Health is monitoring the spreads of COVID-19 Omicron Variant and accelerating the COVID-19 prevention and control activities. On 14 January, Union Minister for Health Dr Thet Khaing Win met with the members of COVID-19 Control and Emergency Response Committee and the Union Minister expressed the following points during the meeting:

• In order to protect the transmission of COVID-19 viruses from other countries to a certain extent of time, the returnees from abroad have been quarantined at designated hotels and centres and they will be allowed to return their homes only after having swab tests with specified frequency.

The returnees from abroad through border crossing posts placed in a restricted area under the regulations and guidelines of COVID-19. |They will be discharged after having swab tests.

Ministry of Health release timely statements on detection of SARS-CoV-2 Variant Omicron in persons returning from abroad by Relief Flights as follows:

- On 12 January 2022, two Myanmar nationals returned from India.
- On 13 January 2022, 40 Myanmar nationals and two foreigners returned from India, UAE, Malaysia and Thailand.
- On 14 January 2022, three foreigners returned from Philippines and Malaysia.

On 15 January 2022, ten Omicron cases included five Myanmar nationals, three foreigners who returned from India. Other two are the close contacts of family members of infected persons. Up to 15-1-2022, the figure of Omicron cases has risen to 76 in total.

It is reported that the Ministry of Health is speeding up the activities of monitoring the spreads of COVID-19 Omicron Variant

and the COVID-19 prevention and control activities. In this regard, the Ministry is reportedly making all-round efforts including preparing quarantine and treatment centres, necessary medications and oxygen by cooperating with relevant ministries, local authorities, generous donors and volunteers.

# **COVID-19 Prevention, Control, and Treatment Activities Continue in Respective Regions and States**

COVID-19 prevention, control and treatment activities such as opening quarantine centres and vaccinating people against COVID-19 continue in respective regions and states.

- As of 16 January, 21.4 million people in total have been vaccinated against COVID-19. About 17.6 million people have received two-time full doses of the vaccine and 3.8 million people have received the first doses. 38.9 million people in total have been inoculated against COVID-19 in Myanmar.
- A total of 1,374,604 students aged 12 years and above from Basic Education Middle and High schools in respective regions and states have been vaccinated against COVID-19 as second dose and

- 148,382 students as first dose on 16 January.
- Venerable Master Yin Shun, Abbot of Hongfa Temple, vice-president of the Buddhist Association of China donated 5,000 units of Sinopharm vaccines to the monks and nuns presided by Bhamo Sayadaw Dr Bhaddanta Kumara Bhivamsa.
- The officials from the People's Republic of China donated 50,000 doses of Sinovac to local people in Northern Shan state at the Nantaw gate in Myanmar-China border crossing.

For the COVID-19 prevention, control and treatment, one million of Sputnik Light COVID-19 vaccine purchased from Russian Federation and 400,000 doses of Sputnik Light COVID-19 donated by Russian Federation arrived at Myanmar in January 2022.

- 400,000 doses of Sputnik Light donated by Russian Federation arrived at Myanmar on 13 January.
- Of one million doses of Sputnik Light purchased from Russia, 488,000 doses as the first batch arrived at Myanmar on 13 January, and 512,000 doses as second batch arrived at Myanmar on 16 January.

The Ministry of Health has received a total of 46.1 million of COVID-19 vaccines purchased from abroad (15.4 million doses of Covishield, 26.7 million doses of Sinopharm, three million doses of Sinovac,

one million doses of Sputnik-V) and a total of 15.4 million doses as donations (2.5 million doses of Covishield, 3.6 million doses of Sinopharm, 6.7 million doses of Sinovac, 2.2 million doses of Covaxin and 0.4 million doses of Sputnik-V), totaling 61.5 million doses.

#### KNPP and So-Called PDF Terrorist Groups Committing War Crimes in Loikaw Township of Kayah State against Geneva Conventions and International Laws

#### **Press Release**

According to the information tips of conscientious people who do not want and receive the terrorist groups that the KNPP and so-called PDF terrorists were taking positions at Government Technological University (GTU) and Buddha Park in Mong Lone ward of Loikaw in Kayah state, the security forces raided the places in the morning of 11 January. The terrorists took positions in houses, governmental and religious buildings, and used the human shields without letting locals in the ward move from the danger zone to safe places in the attacks. But the security forces tried their best with the least shots to their targets not to har more than the innocent civilians who were applied as human shields.

In the clash, at noon of 11 January and in the morning of 12 January, the KNPP and s o-called PDF terrorist groups launched attacks on Loikaw prison using heavy and small we apons for no reasons from three places of the ward to hurt the prisoners and occur prison rio t. Therefore, the security forces conducted counterattacks not to harm the inmates within the rights to defend themselves against the attacks. The engagement stopped in the evening of 11 January and at noon of 12 January, and terrorists moved back to west and southeast of the location. As soon as the terrorist groups and armed insurgents retreated, the security force s counterattacked on them using heavy weapons and air supporting fire.

Moreover, the KNPP and so-called PDF terrorist groups refilled their numbers using the fields and routes of Hmone Pyar, Bardo and Phaya Phyu villages at noon of 12 January and so the security forces launched air supporting fire and attacked them using heavy weap ons, and the terrorists retreated to the west and south. In the attacks, some of the governmen t buildings and dormitories of prison were damaged and no civilian was injured.

The KNPP and so-called PDF terrorist groups took positions in religious buildings, e ducational buildings and houses that are not military targets, and used locals as human shiel ds without letting them move from the danger zone. Moreover, the terrorists groups intentio nally attacked the countryside prisons where only hundreds of prisoners are paying for their sins with their sweats. But, these prisons are not military targets. Therefore, such doings vio lated war crimes according to the Geneva Conventions and International Laws, and the effective action will be taken against them for these war crimes under the Counter-Terrorism Law and other existing laws.

- The KNPP and so-called PDF terrorists took positions in houses, governmental and religious buildings, and used the human shields without letting locals in the ward move from the danger zone to safe places in the attacks. But the security forces tried their best with the least shots to their targets not to harm the innocent civilians who were applied as human shields.
- The KNPP and so-called PDF terrorist groups took positions in religious buildings, educational buildings and houses that are not military targets, used locals as human shields, and intentionally attacked the countryside prisons where only hundreds of prisoners are paying for their sins with their sweats. But, these prisons are not military targets. Therefore, such doings violated war crimes according to the Geneva Convention and International Law.

### So-Called PDF-Terrorists Launched Terrorist Attacks against Education Sector

So-called PDF terrorists with the intention of utter devastation, are using schools as fortified bases to commit violent acts, blowing up and burning down the education infrastructures, and terrorizing education staff as follows:

- On 11 January, a high school teacher of the Basic Education Sub-high School (U Nout) in Pale township of Magway region, was abducted by about 30 members of so-called PDF terrorists and brought him along the path connected between Nga Sin and Ti villages while he was going to Myitkyina township with public transport bus.
- On 12 January, terrorists burnt down the properties of basic education postprimary school of Daitayar village, Phyu township of Bago region. Due to their acts of sabotage, concrete floor, concrete wall, and furniture in the corner classroom at school building were destroyed in fire and three window glasses were also shattered.
- On 13 January, as so-called PDF terrorists were fortifying the school in Marathein village to carry out acts of violence in Htigyaing township of Sagaing re-

- gion, security forces raided on the place and seized arms, ammunition, mortar shells and related materials used in terrorist acts, including 107 mm rocket launcher shells from there.
- In the evening of 13 January terrorists came back to the village again and rashly set fire to the school not to leave the evidence of their camping in it, while security forces were out of the Marathein village to conduct security duties for local peace and tranquillity. The arson attacks of terrorists left a two-storey school building, a one-storey school building and another wooden school building destroyed in fire.

Under the instruction of NUG with the aim of utter devastation, terrorists are attacking security forces by taking cover of educational buildings and public houses in villages. Moreover, they are also violently threatening, killing, extorting and robbing the teachers. Furthermore, the terrorists, who do not want the peaceful learning of students for their future, are conducting attacks by intentionally using schools, which are for the teaching student, as fortified camps clearly mount to the war crimes un-

der the Geneva Conventions and international laws. Further necessary efforts will be made to take action against the terrorists under Counter-Terrorism Law, Penal Code and other relevant existing laws for such crimes.

# PDF Terrorists Launch Violent Attacks Against Targets Relating to Religion


Terrorist groups of CRPH, NUG and their subordinate terrorist units of so-called PDF with the aim of utter devastation of the State are accelerating the acts of terrorism and sabotages in various ways against targets relating to religion including staff of religious affairs and religious buildings that are not guarded by security forces.

- On 10 January, a staff of Township Religious Affairs Administration Department in Kalay township, was abducted by so-called terrorists when he was leaving for Meiktila township by the public transport bus as he was transferred to the District Religious Affairs Administration Department in Meiktila.
- Acting on the information tips provided by some locals, security forces raid the Yinkyin village monastery where terrorists are gathering to conduct sabotages in Yay-U township on 14 January. During the raid, the terrorists attempted to flee in disarray.
- From the monastery they used to stay, security forces found and confiscated 20

homemade short guns, one 12 volt gun, one Energa grenade, 125 rounds of assorted ammunition, 10 homemade mines, two grenades, two walkie-talkie devices, two motorbikes, a car, other related items used in terrorist acts, rice bags and onion bags which were forcibly collected from local people.

• In the evening of 14 January, two terrorists riding a motorbike threw a homemade grenade into the Sasana 2500 compound near the precinct of Maha Myat Mu Ni Buddha Image which is regarded as the holy pinnacle of Buddha Sasana by people in Chanmyathazi Township, Mandalay. The grenade fell and exploded on the lawn in front of a building and no injury and damage are reported.

In order to support the destructive acts of terrorist groups CRPH, NUG and so-called PDF terrorists, they attempt to import the necessary arms and ammunitions using various means and hide them in some monasteries. Moreover, they are also doing the obnoxious acts such using the monasteries as



camps, burning them down and brutally killing the Buddhist Sangas, and destroying religious sites including the Maha Myat Muni Buddha Image. Therefore, entire people are disgusted with their nefarious acts to inflict damages to the Buddha Sasana and create public panic.

People are also urged to report the information of terrorists to the nearest security forces to contribute to the efforts of relevant authorities to arrest the terrorists.

- In the evening of 14 January, two terrorists riding a motorbike threw a home-made grenade into the Sasana 2500 compound near the precinct of Maha Myat Mu Ni Buddha Image which is regarded as the holy pinnacle of Buddha Sasana by people in Chanmyathazi Township, Mandalay. The grenade fell and exploded on the lawn in front of a building and no injury and damage are reported.
- The entire people are disgusted with the nefarious acts of terrorist groups of CRPH, NUG and so-called PDF to inflict damages to the Buddha Sasana and create public panic.

# So-Called PDF Terrorists Committed Robbery of Cash and Goldwares at Gunpoint

Robberies of cash and goldwares at gun point took place in Taze Township of Sagaing Region and Ywangan Township of southern Shan state on 11 January as follow:

- Two junior clerks of Kani township general administration office, residents of Wayar village were abducted by so-called PDF terrorists on the way back home from Kani township after withdrawing salary of K186,000 and K1.056 million of cash assistances for Persons with Disabilities (PWDs).
- While Ma Soe Soe, 47, daughter of a retired doctor U Tin Shwe, 77, was at

her home in the Maha Myaing ward of Taze township, four armed men riding motorbikes arrived at her home, robbed properties a total worth K6,310,000 and cash at gunpoint and ran away. The robbed items included one I-Phone 6 Plus mobile phone worth K500,000, another cash of Kyat 450,000 kept in the upstairs of the house, four platinum rings, one diamond ring, one platinum necklace, one three-colored necklace, one three-colored ring, one bank book.

• While Ma Ei Ei Mon, 32, Htet Aung, 32, an in-charge of microfinance functions

from PACT MYANMAR Microfinance Fund, and Ma Tin Myo Oo, 39 were working in functions for microfinance at Ma Ei Ei Mon's home of the Nwarbangyi village, six armed men with hunting guns, who are riding motorcycles, came to them and forcibly robbed loan of money K4 Million, two cell phones, one National Registration Card, one driving license and two backpacks at gun point.

The PDF terrorists, subordinate armed wings of NUG have received no more cash

assistances from NUG and donation cash from people. Consequently, in order to sustain their survival, it is found that they are not only collecting extortion money forcibly from innocent people but also committing the nefarious crimes of robbery.

It is reported that security forces continue necessary operations to sweep the terrorists who committed the crime of robbery at gunpoint.

#### Offenders Convicted of Contacting with Terrorist Groups and Committing Terrorist Acts by Military Tribunal

The following offenders who committed the acts of terrorism and were in contact with terrorist groups were convicted under military tribunal as follows:

- Three offenders including Waiyan Tun (aka) Win Yoe living in Hlaingthaya (east) township, and Bo Bo Min (aka) Khit Saung Hmu and Soe Thu Tun living in North Okkalapa township were sentenced to 'life imprisonment' under Sections 50 (A) and 50 (I) of Counter Terrorism Law on 12 January for contacting with terrorist groups; throwing a grenade to a civilian house; taking explosive
- trainings in the area of EAO; being involved in the assassination of a hundred-house elder; shooting the motor-vehicle polices at near Payarlan traffic point; and participating in the terrorist attacks.
- Thura Lin (aka) Thura and Zaw Thurakhun (aka) Moe Zaw Than (at large) were sentenced to the 'death penalty' under Section 50 (A)/54 of Counter-Terrorism Law on 12 January for shooting a hundred-house elder dead in No. (11) ward of Shwepyitha township of Yangon region.

23 types of crimes to be adjudicated by Military Tribunal in the townships under Martial Law order has been released as an appendix and effective and prompt legal actions reportedly have been taken against those who committed the crimes.
