Chairman of State Administration Council Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing Holds Talks with Cambodian Prime Minister Samdech Akka Moha Sena Padei Techo HUN SEN



The Chairman of the State Administration Council (SAC) Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing received the Cambodian Prime Minister Samdech Akka Moha Sena Padei Techo HUN SEN, who arrived here to pay a working visit to Myanmar, at the Credentials Hall of the Office of the SAC Chairman in Nay Pyi Taw on 7 January.

The Chairman of the SAC Prime Minister welcomed the Cambodian Prime Minister and they then posed for documentary photos. Afterwards, the Chairman of the SAC Prime Minister and the Cambodian Prime Minister cordially discussed the following points:

- They exchanged views on the promotion of diplomatic relations, friendly ties and cooperation between the two countries, the progress of the internal peace process in Myanmar and assistances to be

rendered by the special envoy of the ASEAN Chair and Cambodia.

- Moreover, they cordially exchanged views on the undertakings of Myanmar in accord with the five-point consensus of ASEAN, the prevention of COVID-19 and humanitarian aid, and efforts of the State Administration Council in development of the nation in accord with the five-point road map.

The meeting was attended by the Chairman of the SAC Prime Minister together with officials, Union Ministers. The Cambodian Prime Minister accompanied by Deputy Prime Minister, Minister of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation H.E. Mr PRAK Sokhonn, Senior Minister, Minister of Industry, Science, Technology and Innovation H.E. Mr CHAM Prasidh, Minister attached to the Prime Minister's Office, Secretary-General of the Council of the De-

Myanmar and Cambodia Hold Bilateral Talks



Myanmar and Cambodia held bilateral talks at the meeting hall of the State Administration Council Chairman's Office in Nay Pyi Taw on 7 January. During the event, the Chairman of the State Administration Council (SAC) Prime Minister and the Cambodian Prime Minister exchanged

greetings and gave their encouragements to each other.

During the meeting, the Cambodian Prime Minister Samdech Akka Sena Padei Techo HUN SEN discussed the following points:

- Both countries gave help each other in taking preventive, control and treatment measures of COVID-19 and he expressed thanks to Myanmar for its donation of COVID-19 vaccines to Cambodia.
- Arrangements will be made for signing the agreement to reduce the double taxation with cooperation in the trade sector of both countries. It is necessary to draw a new plan for education cooperation.
- Regarding the tourism industry, he discussed the soonest implementation of a travel partner city program between Bagan and Siem Reap, and the resumption of flights amidst the COVID-19 restrictions.

Then, the Chairman of the SAC Prime Minister discussed the following points:

- The goodwill visit of the Cambodian Prime Minister in the early year of 2022 would strengthen the friendly relations between the two countries. As Ministries of Foreign Affairs between the two countries have signed the agreement on cooperation in policy affairs, they should hold talks between ministries of both countries at the opportune time.
- The Prime Minister pledged to arrange the signing of the agreement to reduce the double taxation in the trade sector of both countries. Cooperation will be made in the enhancement of the tourism industry between the two countries. The tourism services will resume at a time when the COVID-19 can be controlled to some extent, and the aviation services will be resumed to Cambodia as soon as possible.
- In the religious and culture sector, the Prime Minister expressed his satisfaction of allowing 249 Cambodian monks and nuns at Buddhist missionary universities in Myanmar from 1999 to 2020.
- The agreement on the 2017-2021 education cooperation program will be extended for further cooperation. Further cooperation will be undertaken in Defence affairs.
- The countries from the Mekong Basin need to be united. The Prime Minister expressed thanks to Cambodian for its support to Myanmar with a positive attitude in the international and ASEAN arenas. He also said he is striving for ensuring the development of the region and peace and stability in the nation.
- In his tenure, the Prime Minister said more than 48,000 prisoners were granted a pardon, and more prisoners will be granted a pardon at the appropriate time. Moreover, he set this year as the year of peace. He expressed his warm welcome to the special envoy of the Cambodian Prime Minister to cooperate in the peace process of Myanmar. He said he was satisfied with today's meeting focusing on cooperation in both countries and regional issues.

The meeting was attended by the Chairman of the SAC Prime Minister accompanied by officials, Union Ministers, Myanmar Ambassador to Cambodia and officials. The Cambodian Prime Minister accompanied by Cambodian Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation, Senior Minister, Minister of Industry, Science, Technology and Innovation of Cambodia, Minister attached to

the Prime Minister's Office and General-Secretary of Council for the Development of Cambodia, Ministers attached to the Prime Minister's Office, Deputy Ministers for Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation, Deputy Commander-in-Chief of the Royal Cambodian Armed Forces and Com-

mander of the Royal Cambodian Army, Cambodian Ambassador to Myanmar and delegation members joined the meeting.

The Chairman of the SAC Prime Minister accompanied by Vice-Chairman of the SAC Deputy Prime Minister Vice-



At the invitation of Senior General Min Aung Hlaing, Chairman of the State Administration Council Prime Minister of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar, Samdech Akka Moha Sena Padei Techo HUN SEN, Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Cambodia, led a high level delegation to pay a working visit to the Republic of the Union of Myanmar on 7-8 January 2022.

Samdech Akka Moha Sena Padei Techo HUN SEN, Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Cambodia, had a bilateral meeting with Chairman of the State Administration Council

Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing during which both sides discussed a number of bilateral and regional issues of common interest and concerns. The two leaders briefed each other on the recent developments in their respective countries.

On the developments in Myanmar, Chairman of the State Administration Council Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing informed Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Cambodia, that the Myanmar Government had declared ceasefire with all Ethnic Armed Organizations (EAOs) until the end of February 2022 and decided to further extend it until the end of 2022. Continuously, the Senior General also called on all parties concerned to accept the ceasefire in the interest of the country and people, end all acts of violence and exercise utmost restraint. Moreover, Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Cambodia strongly supported with the view to deescalating tension and enable constructive dialogues among relevant stakeholders to achieve enduring peace and national development. Senior General Min Aung Hlaing welcomed the participation of the special envoy of the ASEAN Chair on Myanmar to join the ceasefire talks with and among the EAOs. This important step is embodied in the ASEAN five-point consensus.

To strengthen the efficiency of the delivery of humanitarian assistance to the people of Myanmar, especially to the people who are most in need of help, the two Leaders supported the convening of a meeting among stakeholders such as the special envoy of the ASEAN Chair on Myanmar, the Secretary-General of ASEAN, the representatives of the ASEAN Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Management Centre (AHA Centre), and the Myanmar National Task Force to Facilitate Provision of Humanitarian Assistance through the AHA Centre, the Myanmar Red Cross Society (MRCS) and the relevant United Nations Specialized Agencies. The two sides acknowledged the critical importance of setting up mechanisms and proper facilities for the COVID-19 vaccination programme along with the provision of humanitarian assistance effectively to the people in need without discrimination, as nothing is more important than saving people's lives.

Senior General Min Aung Hlaing congratulated Cambodia for assuming the ASEAN Chairmanship 2022 and welcomed the appointment of Prak Sokhonn, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation, as special envoy of the ASEAN Chair on Myanmar and pledged full support to the latter in fulfilling his mandate to implement the five-point consensus in accordance with the ASEAN Charter. He also emphasized that implementation of the five-point consensus should be complementary in realization of the five-point roadmap of the State Administration Council.

The Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Cambodia, shared Cambodia's Win-Win Policy success in achieving national reconciliation, lasting peace, stability, development and prosperity. He also stressed that based on the experiences and lessons learned from Cambodia's peace process, complete peace and national reconciliation cannot be achieved without participation and agreement from all parties involved. In the same spirit, Chairman of the State Administration Council Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing has assured the facilitation of the visit of the special envoy to Myanmar and to meet with all parties concerned taking into account of the prevailing situation in Myanmar.

The two sides also exchanged views on bilateral cooperation to further enhance the existing friendly relations between the two peoples, particularly in the context of global health crisis. Chairman of the State Administration Council Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing expressed his deep appreciation to the Government and people of Cambodia for the additional donations of 3,200,000 masks, 30,000 personal protection equipment (PPE), 50 ventilator machines, 50 patient monitors and accessories, and 50 oxygen concentrators and other medical equipment to assist Myanmar in the COVID-19 prevention and control activities.

The meeting was concluded in an atmosphere of mutual understanding and in a frank and candid manner.

Statement on Detection of SARS-CoV-2 Variant Omicron

7 January 2022

1. The Ministry of Health is continuously conducting “COVID-19 Molecular Disease Surveillance”. The ministry released a statement on 28 December 2021 that among those returnees by Relief Flight, four have tested positive for SARS-CoV-2 Variant Omicron.
2. The 22 laboratory samples of the COVID-19 virus of the returnees were sent to the National Health Laboratory and No (1) Defence Services General Hospital (1000-bed) on 7 January 2022 and the SARS-CoV-2 Variant Omicron was found in 12 laboratory samples.
3. The 12 Omicron cases are 11 Myanmar nationals and one foreigner – eight returned from the UAE by the relief flight while three from Malaysia and one from India.
4. The patients are admitted to the designated hospitals for medical treatment and the passengers who returned together with them now undergo Strict Quarantine and lab test.
5. Therefore, it is announced that the Ministry is stepping up the COVID-19 disease monitoring and control activities plus disease prevention, control and treatment activities.

Myanmar Exports 100,000 Tonnes of White Rice and 50,000 Tonnes of Parboiled Rice to Sri Lanka in 2022 and 2023



Myanmar signed a government-to-government (G-to-G) rice export bilateral Agreement with Sri Lanka on 7 January. The virtual signing ceremony was attended by Union Minister for Commerce Dr Pwint San, Minister for Trade of Sri Lanka Dr Bandula Gunawardhana, and other officials concerned.

During the event, the Union Minister Dr. Pwint San said:

- The G-to-G agreement is signed as an initial step to export other products including rice of the farming sector in order to promote bilateral trade.
- The country also invites investments in the tourism industry that make profits for two countries.
- Myanmar always welcomes further cooperation works to develop the economy of the two country.

Then, the Minister for Trade of Sri Lanka talked about the following points:

- The establishment of diplomatic relations with Myanmar began in 1949.
- He expressed words of thanks for exporting rice which is primary food for Sri Lanka under the G-to-G system.
- He also pleaded to improve the bilateral trade and investment between the two countries.

According to the G-to-G agreement, Myanmar Rice Federation and Sri Lanka State Trading (General) Corporation will supervise the rice trade, and Myanmar will have to export 100,000 tonnes of white rice and 50,000 tonnes of parboiled rice to Sri Lanka in 2022 and 2023.

- A government-to-government (G-to-G) rice export bilateral Agreement between Myanmar and Sri Lanka was signed by relevant officials and Myanmar will have to export 100,000 tonnes of white rice and 50,000 tonnes of parboiled rice to Sri Lanka in 2022 and 2023.

Terrorists Disrupting the Peaceful Learning of Schoolchildren Commit Bomb and Arson Attacks on Schools

The so-called PDF terrorists, who are not willing to see the peaceful learning of schoolchildren, are committing the bomb and arson attacks on schools in some townships. Their attacks are as follows:


- Terrorists, who do not want to see the learning of schoolchildren, set fire to a primary school constructed with the fund contributed by local people located in the Kagon village of Myaungmya township in Ayawady region on 7 January. Due to the arson attack, the whole (80ft in length, 25ft in width, 12ft in height) primary school building was burned down.
- Terrorists placed a barrel of coal tar surrounded by seven bottles pasted with anti-government texts at the southern entrance of the Myanmar Institute of Information Technology (MITT) University in Chanmyatharzi township of Mandalay region on 7 January. The barrel of coal tar exploded during having checked but no casualty and damage were reported.
- An IED, which was laid under the ground in the security gate at the entrance of the Basic Education High School (BEHS) in the Kim Mon Chaung village of Mon state, exploded on 6 January. Due to the explosion, two security

forces members who were undertaking security measures for schoolchildren near the gate and Ma Phyu Phyu Htwe, 27, who lives in the Kim Mon Chaung village, got minor shrapnel wounds. Once the security forces checked the area, they spotted an unexploded homemade mine, deactivated it and seized it.

village of Myaung township of Mayway region and ran away. One of the IEDs exploded near the school building called Myonyun Khantee and another unexploded one was found near the concrete wall of the school. The unexploded IED was then cleared by demolition.

- On 6 January, two terrorists threw two IEDs in the campus of BEHS in Taingma
- The entry doors of BEHS in Pans Swar village of Myaing township of Magway region was blown up and destroyed by

terrorists using a homemade mine on 5 January.

The so-called PDF terrorists are accelerating the acts of terrorism as per their intention of utter devastation. Moreover, they are also recklessly doing the sabotages with various intentions to destroy the peaceful learning of the students who are the future of the State as well as to inflict casualties to

the local people living in peace.

Security forces continue taking necessary measures to identify and arrest the perpetrators of terrorists who have committed the terrorist acts such as bombing attacks and arson attacks on the schools in the above-mentioned incidents.

Tatmadaw Reoccupy Kyapazetgyi Camp in Hway Pon Laung-Kau Kau region of Kayah State Shortly after a Surprise Attack of Large-Scale Terrorist Groups

It is reported that Tatmadaw reoccupied the Kyapazetgyi camp in the Hway Pon Laung-Kau Kau region of Kayah State at noon after they made a tactical retreat in good order for a while as a large-scale terrorist group of KNPP and PDF launched a surprise attack on the camp where measures are being conducted by Tatmadaw to protect the region on 7 January in the morning.

The KNPP and so-called PDF terrorist groups attacked the Tatmadaw's Kyapazetgyi camp, where security forces are undertaking the measures to protect that area in Kayah State, using small arms and heavy weapons. However, the security forces members made a tactical retreat from the camp for a while and conducted a planned synchronous counterattack on terrorist groups with air and fire support.

As the reinforcements, moreover,

were also moved to around the battle area by air, Tatmadaw reoccupied the camp at noon and the terrorist groups retreated in disorder to the northeast part of the region. In the attack, some Tatmadaw officers and soldiers were injured and the dead bodies of terrorists along with arms and ammunition were also seized.

Tatmadaw strictly follows the statement on ceasefire and perpetual peace which was extended to 28 February 2022. The security forces members, however, have the right to defend themselves from such terrorist groups' attacks on military columns, camps and bases, using the right of self-defense. Therefore, the security forces members are undertaking to beef up security in the region, keeping in line with the Rules of Engagement (ROE).

Weapons/ammunition seized from terrorists

Nine offenders including Aung Paing Thu (aka) Moe Nyo, living in North Okkalapa township reportedly sentenced to the penalty of 'life imprisonment' on 6 January 2022 for conducting bombing attacks, being involved in assassinations of innocent civilians, taking explosive trainings in the area of EAO, contacting with the associations declared as terrorist groups and collecting donation cash to support the groups.

Four other offenders including Zwe Wai Yan Htet (aka) Eddison were convicted by Military Tribunal of Martial Law and sentenced to the penalty of 'death' on 6 January 2022 for shooting and killing a hundred-houses elder living in Yuzana street, No. (5/1) ward of Shwepyitha township of Yangon region. On 13 October 2021.

A total of 10 offenders including Soe Naing were convicted by Military Tribunal of Martial Law and sentenced to the 20 years imprisonment with labour on 6 January for harassing the ward administration

members doing their duties to ensure community peace and security, attempts to blow up a house of a hundred-houses elder using a homemade bomb with timer on 17 November 2021.

The so-called PDF terrorist groups are recklessly doing the acts of terrorism with an intent to disrupt the State's peace, tranquillity and rule of law. Therefore, security force members are identifying the terrorist groups and their supporters and taking punitive legal actions against them.

23 types of crimes to be adjudicated by Military Tribunal in the townships under Martial Law order has been released as an appendix and effective and prompt legal actions reportedly have been taken against those who committed the crimes.
