Chairman of State Administration Council Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing Delivers an Address at the 1/2022 Meeting of Union Government of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar



The 1/2022 meeting of the Union Government of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar was held at the meeting hall of the State Administration Council Chairman's Office in Nay Pyi Taw on 2 February. The Chairman of the State Administration Council (SAC) Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing delivered an address at the meeting as follows:

- The current government is in office for eight months in the 2020- 2021 FY. The former government took office for four months. After the present government assumed the State responsibility, there was only some progress in the economic and security sectors because of a certain political situation.
- Regarding the economic sector, there is still weakness in fulfilling the requirements of transport business and inputs including raw material supply for production. Terrorists committed terror acts ranging from robbery and murdering cases to the destructive acts of blowing up mines and setting fire starting from political protests. So, security forces controlled these activities.
- With regard to the armed organizations, the Tatmadaw also effectively controlled them. During the process, innocent people, civil servants and members of the Myanmar Police Force and Tatmadaw, who were shouldering security duties, were killed or wounded. The Senior General expressed his sadness for these casualties. Because of those incidents, the government could not exert all-out efforts for the economy.
- Provisional statements show a trade surplus of US\$677 million during the period till October in the 2020-2021 FY due to the efforts of the Union Ministers with the public involvement amidst the criticisms, attacks and disturbances.
- The country needs a sharp rise in exports. It is necessary to encourage the export of agriculture and livestock products instead of natural resources.
- As the production industry needs man-



power, it generates job opportunities for citizens. So, efforts should be made to further increase livestock and agriculture exports.

- Regarding the export products, the country has the capacity to export a large volume of livestock and agriculture products to its neighbours, China, India and Bangladesh.
- Quality export products can generate income for the nation. Rice, bean, maize and livestock products are the main businesses of some 70 percent of the people.
- As regards the cotton which is included the export items, the cultivation of cotton plants is expected to exceed the production more than the demand according to the calculation of relevant ministries.
- But the country imported textile and related materials worth US\$1,280.152 million in 2021.
- If the country produces quality threads made of Myanmar's cotton, the import volume will decline and the domestic cotton production will meet the local demand and contribute much for local garment industries.
- Fulfilling the local textile and clothing needs is the top priority of the country.

Continuously, the garment factories need to export their products to the foreign countries.

- In this regard, local and foreign investment must be invited to manufacture quality goods by upgrading the weaving industry.
- During the year 2021, the weather was fine and rainfall was good enough for storing water in dams across the country.
- But, water stored in dams is to be utilized to generate electricity. The water stored in dams is to be effectively utilized not only in the production of electricity but in agriculture.
- As there are many cultivated areas with pumped and irrigated water in our country, it is needed to take systematic educational tasks on water utility management.
- The river water pumping projects can be implemented through solar energy. If the river water pumping projects will be developed as soon as possible, the agricultural businesses in the upcountry regions will be thriving.
- A government has to carry out tasks for the development of its country. Only if there is a growth in the people's sources

of revenue, there will be the development of the country. Therefore, the relevant ministries will be required to carry out tasks they should, in order to enhance the agricultural businesses.

- Regarding the electricity supply, the government has been making all-out efforts to ensure adequate supply. It is necessary for all to boost the supply, on one hand, it is required to save electric power.
- The generation of power is a task given priority to ensure improvement of socio-economic life of the people. Moreover, the arrangements must be required for generating the sufficient electricity for improvement of socio-economic life of the people, operation of businesses, manufacturing and public transportation services.

Regarding the Economic Development of the State and Enhancement of Defence Capability

- The year 2022 becomes a challenging year for us. If we can revive the economy, we will win the trust of the people.
- We have three ambitions. For the first point, we have pledged to revive the State economy. The second point is that we will do all tasks related to multiparty democratization mentioned in the political future tasks.
- Our country does not practise the military conscription law yet because of happening the internal armed conflicts. If we have comprehensively implemented the State economy and multiparty democratization that were mentioned in the first and second points, we have to enhance the Defence capability for the third point.

- At that time, citizens need to serve the military service under the law. They have to serve it for one and a half year, or two or three years in line with the prescription depending on the situation of the country.
- If we are weak in the economy, we will feel inferior. If we are weak in political power, other countries would make trouble for us. If we have weak Defence capability, we will face the assaults of others. Our fence will not be safe. These are three musts for us.

After the Chairman of the SAC Prime Minister heard the reports on the respective sectors presented by the Union Ministers, he made concluding remarks as follows:

- In spending the foreign exchange, trade deficit came out in the times of previous governments. So, it is necessary to calculate such prospects, ministries need to save spending on foreign exchange except for compulsory measures.
- Regarding the tax, the ministries must levy the tax which should be collected. Only when the private sector improves will the export volume be larger. Income from the exportation will generate tax for the State. Ministries need to strive for earning the deserved taxes rather than increase the rate of tax.
- The hiking prices are based on high production costs, larger transport charges and high prices of raw materials. As it depends on the high transport charge, it is necessary to improve the public transport system. If so, consumption of fuel bought in foreign currency can be cut effectively.
- Efforts must be made for providing adequate raw materials to the domestic in-

dustries and for increasing the production of goods to meet the demand.

- Only when the authorities encourage domestic production, the costs will decline and currency will firm. If doing so, it will contribute to the State economy and protect the national interests. Hence, all need to strive for implementing it.
- Therefore, Ministries should make efforts for the development of the nation in various ways and means during the rest period of the FY.

Vice-Chairman of the State Administration Council (SAC) Deputy Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services Commander-in-Chief (Army) Vice-Senior General Soe Win accompanied by senior military officers from Office of Commander-in-Chief and officials met with officers, other ranks and families from the respective military stations, and district and township-level departmental personnel and town elders from Kayah state as follows:

- On 2 and 3 February, Vice-Senior General Soe Win met with officers, other ranks and families from the respective military stations of Hpasawng, Bawlakhe, Hpruso and departmental personnel and town elders from Bawlakhe township.
- On 3 February, Vice-Senior General Soe Win met with not only district and township-level departmental personnel and town elders from Kayah state but also the officers, other ranks and families

from the military stations of Loikaw and Pekon.

During the meetings, Vice-Chairman of the State Administration Council (SAC) Deputy Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services Commander-in-Chief (Army) Vice-Senior General Soe Win stressed the following points:

- In 2020 Multi-party General Election, as the winning party, NLD with over 10.4 million of voting frauds attempted to take over the State power forcefully by convening the Hluttaw, the Tatmadaw assumed three branches of State power under the section 417, 418 and 419 of the Constitution (2008).
- The Tatmadaw has never taken over the State power but assumed it under the constitution without abolishing and re-drafting it.
- The Constitution (2008) is a legislation that was designed with anticipation to

meet the desire of the entire people for the multi-party democracy system and adopted with the votes of 92 percent of the people.

- So far, some organizations and people from home and abroad misunderstand the Tatmadaw's assumption of State responsibilities as a coup.
- Some civil servants joined the CDM under threats and pressures. Likewise, some powerful foreign countries imposed the economic sanctions.
- But the good service personnel could overcome the difficult year with the spirit of unity for success and endurance.
- There were controversial issues of advanced voting and overtime voting. Some candidates even did not get the votes cast for them by their families.
- Although the Tatmadaw and political parties demanded to solve those problems, the responsible authorities were ignored. Hence, the Tatmadaw assumed three branches of State power under the section 417, 418 and 419 of the Constitution (2008).
- In forming the SAC, the military personnel and civilians are organized in a balanced manner and ethnic people are also included in it.
- Although there was weakness in the data of vaccination during the first and second waves of the COVID-19, the VMIS Programme on Web portal has been developed.
- During the third wave, it found that the oxygen demand was high and the government has undertaken effective measures to achieve COVID-19 protective gears, including oxygen in time. The international countries, even the INGOs were amazed at such best control.
- Good civil servants and security forces could overcome economic hardships in the period of COVID-19's third wave, international pressures and terrorist acts during the emergency period by taking the people's strength.
- Upon completion of the State of Emergency, preparations must be made for holding the free and fair Multi-party General Election, and it is necessary to

ensure regional peace. The people must have the right to cast votes of their own accord without fear. The SAC Chairman Prime Minister is striving by declaring 2022 as the year of peace.

- If the acts of terrorism continue to happen, elections will not be held. The SAC will keep its pledge. When the acts of terrorism stopped, the tasks of the election such as collecting voting lists, holding election campaign and setting up polling station will be carried out in the rightful manner.
- Once the measures are taken as the provisions in the emergency period, Tatmadaw will hold free and fair multi-party democracy general election and hand over the State power to the winning party in line with the democratic standards.
- Free and fair general elections play a major role and justice is the lifeblood of the multi-party democracy. Only then, genuine representatives, who would choose the head of state and form the government, could be elected.
- The terrorist groups such as NUG, CRPH and their affiliation PDF are spreading false information on social

media and that the government is broadcasting true news via state-owned media in a timely manner.

- As Kayah State is full of good domestic products, manufacturing of these goods on a commercial scale to be exported can increase per-capita income as well as the GDP of Kayah State.
- All ethnic nationals in Kayah state are the citizens of the Union and there were histories that they all fight together to the colonist with the unity spirit. All people from the state are urged to strive for gaining better development through unity in line with “Unity for Success”.

The Vice-Chairman of the State Administration Council Deputy Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services Commander-in-Chief (Army) Vice-Senior General Soe Win, accompanied by the Kayah State Chief Minister and officials, paid homage to Myonam Shwezedi Pagoda in Loikaw township of Kayah State on 3 February. The Vice-Senior General and party visited Ottarayon Monastery in the city and paid respects to Sayadaw of Thiri Mingalapon (Hawgyi) Agga Maha Saddhama Jotikadhaja Kayah State Ovada Sayadaw Bhaddanta Sandimalled members of Sanghas, supplicated religious affairs to the Sayadaws and sought the advice from them.

The Vice-Senior General and party also provided clothes aided by the Ministry of Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement to the people from the villages of in Hpruso township and some neighbourhoods in Loikaw who were displaced due to the disturbances by terrorists and have temporarily taken shelter in the Buddhist monasteries of

Loikaw township. The Vice-Senior General and party then met with religious leaders of RC Christianity, Islam, Hinduism and Kawhtoebone (Tagundaing).

During the meeting with the religious leaders, the Vice-Chairman of the State Administration Council stressed the following points:

- The participation in religious organizations is important for the sake of the State. As religious leaders influenced over those who have faith in respective religions in respective areas, they are capable of serving the interests of relevant regions.
- Provided that people cooperate with the government in peace and stability of the region through advices of religions, Kayah State will have peace and stability as early as possible and be able to strive for the development of the regions as usual.

- The people who want peace and stability, conscientious people and security force members will fight against the acts of terrorism in cooperation manners. Causing the casualties in the engagement is the manpower of the State and affected the State.
 - As the coup d'état means revocation of the existing Constitution and drawing and approving a new Constitution to be changed to a system that the coup d'état leader and the majority of the people aspire, the handover of power depends on the coup d'état leader.
 - Now, the SAC maintaining the State responsibilities does not have any reason to revoke the Constitution (2008) approved by the people and the Tatmadaw. Due to no reason to revoke the Constitution, three kinds of State power are being maintained within the limited period involved in the provisions of the State of Emergency mentioned in the Constitution to solve the processes of the emergency period. In line with the fifth point of the Five-Point Road Map, the free and fair multiparty democracy general election will be held in the set period to hand over the State power to the winning party.
 - Religious leaders need to clearly clarify the misunderstanding over the coup d'état due to internal and external instigations.
 - As the State of Emergency has been limited under the Constitution, all should not misunderstand the acts of the State. All don't forget that their region restores peace and prosperity thanks to the peace restoration after negotiating the peace process.
 - Misunderstanding and different opinions among ethnic nations cannot develop the region and the nation. Likewise, the reason shown for different religions should not bring diverse opinions.
 - Section 362 of the Constitution mentions that "the Union also recognizes Christianity, Islam, Hinduism and Animism as the religions existing in the Union at the day of the coming into operation of this Constitution". So, they all have an equal term of rights.
- Then, the religious leaders who attended the meeting discussed matters relat-

ed to their respective religions and gave wishes. After the Vice-Chairman of the SAC responded to their discussions and attended to their needs, he presented rice,

cooking oil and foodstuff to the religious leaders and cordially greeted them.

1. The State Administration Council is implementing the five-point Road Map for ensuring stability, development and flourishing the genuine, disciplined multiparty democracy. The government adopted the policy that “Emphasis will be placed on achieving enduring peace for the entire nation in line with the agreements set out in the Nationwide Ceasefire Agreement (NCA)” as the fourth point of the Road Map. To do so, the State Administration Council is continuously implementing the peace process as part of emphasizing the peace in line with the NCA.
2. The Tatmadaw issued 20 statements related to ceasefire from 21 December 2018 to 28 February 2022 to conduct ceasefire. After meeting with the Cambodian Prime Minister taking ASEAN alternate chair on his working visit to Myanmar on 7 and 8 January 2022, a joint declaration was issued to continue the ceasefire till the end of this year.
3. The message of greetings 2022 made by the Chairman of the State Administration Council Prime Minister stated, “The year 2022 is of importance. Coming 12 February is the Diamond Jubilee Union Day and the 4 January 2023 will be the Diamond Jubilee Independence Day. Hence, it is important to further strengthen the sovereignty of the State and progress of the nation with development fruits. So, we have to start the new paces for restoration of the peace this year. As it is mentioned in the fourth point of the five-point road map, all stakeholders and organizations are invited to join the peace talks.” Although Myanmar has regained 75 years, the strengthening of sovereignty and development of the nation do not have improvement as expected due to occurrences of internal armed conflicts and the country loses the strength and capabilities. It is necessary to restore the perpetual peace to apply these strength and capabilities for the State development at full capacity.
4. Restoration of the perpetual peace is very important for building the Union based on democracy and federalism. In this regard, the majority of political parties focused their discussions on construction of the Union based on democracy and federalism within five

years. The National Unity and Peace Restoration Central Committee, the work committee and the coordination committee were formed for working the national unity and perpetual peace. Up to date, the peace committee has so far held meetings with NCA signatories for 16 times, non-NCA signatories for nine times, political parties for seven times and religious leaders and peace negotiators for two times, totalling 34.

5. The State Administration Council is continuously arranging the management for holding meetings with EAOs for restoring the perpetual peace. Except the groups declared as terrorist groups, the government invited not only NCA signatory EAOs but also non-NCA signatory EAOs to take part in the talks for the perpetual peace. The schedule was especially expressed that the meetings would not be restricted with preconditions for the topics of the talks with the aim of freely exchanging views among them.
6. Among three future tasks of the State, two national tasks are “to ensure prosperity of the State and the food sufficiency” and the two political tasks are “to strengthen the genuine, disciplined multiparty democracy and build the Union based on democracy and federalism.” As such, the new steps will be made for the peace as of this year as part of implementing the process for ensuring the integration of peace and sovereignty.
7. It will be focused on talking the perpetual peace through seeking the way to solve answer in negotiation in accord with the democratic practices in order to politically solve the political problems in successive eras as internal affairs of our country. On the occasion coincided with the Diamond Jubilee Union Day, all EAOs are especially invited to the Diamond Jubilee Union Day grand ceremony as well as the pre-coordination meeting on perpetual peace talks to build the Union based on democracy and federalism during the ceremony of the Diamond Jubilee Union Day. The entire ethnic national people are requested to negotiate all stakeholders to attend the free and unrestricted peace talks and the Diamond Jubilee Union Day for restoration of the perpetual peace of the government.

Myanmar Rejects Statements that Interfere in Internal Affairs of the Sovereign State

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs issued a press release rejecting categorically the distorted press statements issued by certain countries and organizations including the UN entities and personnel on the matter that marks one year since the State responsibilities have been transferred to the Tatmadaw pursuant to the State Constitution of Myanmar because those distorted press statements were based on unverified facts and unreliable information that lead to interference in the internal affairs of the country in contrary to the diplomatic code of conduct and the Charter of the United Nations.

Press Release

It is observed that certain countries and organizations including the UN entities and personnel have issued statements on the matter that marks one year since the State responsibilities have been transferred to the Tatmadaw pursuant to the State Constitution of Myanmar.

It is noted that the provoking press release by the High Commissioner for Human Rights was issued on the same day with the closed-door meeting of the United Nations Security Council on Myanmar on 28 January 2022, at the request of Britain. In the meantime, the Special Rapporteur on the situation of human rights in Myanmar did not fail to make other unethical and inciting remarks.

Myanmar is an independent and sovereign state and thus, it cannot accept dictating comments and criticism by foreign countries which interfere in the internal affairs and domestic jurisdiction of the country. Myanmar's democratization is a process implemented at the will of the people. Since this process was severely disturbed by the massive electoral fraud in the 2020 general elections, the Government has devoted itself to establishing a genuine democratic system. Unwavering efforts of the Government have been continuing to ensure the country is on track to multiparty democracy in accordance with the Five-Point Road Map since 1 February 2021. The State Administration Council and the Government of Myanmar, with the ultimate aim for holding a free and fair election, have been making every effort to maintain peace and stability of the country and public safety. In this regard, the international community should render support to the process.

It should be noted that today's violence is the consequences made by the NLD which rejected a lawful settlement of the electoral fraud but chose confrontation and utter devastation. The unlawful and terrorist CRPH, NUG and PDFs further exhorted many youths to terrorists and murderers. Again, those who have devised the plot and incited the youth are found to be backed by certain countries. From February 2021 to January 2022, 312 civil servants including teachers, health staffs and administration officials and 1,988 innocent civilians including monks were killed by the terrorist groups. Moreover, civilian buildings such as schools and residences have been used by the terrorist groups for military purposes and these are clearly the appalling acts of terrorism that constitute war crime which de-

mands universal condemnation by the international community including the United Nations.

While the Government of Myanmar has taken effective actions against the terrorists, those who have not committed any serious crimes have been granted pardons. A total of over 40,000 persons were freed and court hearings of 4,000 cases were dropped.

The Joint Press Release on the visit of the Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Cambodia to Myanmar on 7 January 2022 ensures the extension of a unilateral ceasefire until the end of 2022. In accordance with the Nationwide Ceasefire Agreement (NCA), the Government has held regular discussions with the respective parties including Ethnic Armed Organizations (EAOs) and invited all parties concerned to the peace process.

Myanmar has continued implementing the five-point consensus of ASEAN and constructively engaging with Cambodia, the current Chair of ASEAN. Myanmar will continue to stand on the fundamental principles as stipulated in the ASEAN Charter without prejudicing its sovereignty and national interest.

It hardly sees any gain from foreign interventions by the powerful states and organizations. Instead, it ended up prolonging armed conflicts and disunity among the people of the concerned countries with no hope for peace and stability. The earlier precedents have proven it affirmatively.

The Government of Myanmar, in observance of the responsibilities and obligations entrusted by the State Constitution, is committed to serving peace, stability and interest of its people according to the Five-Point Road Map and political, economic and social objectives of the State. Myanmar categorically rejects those distorted press statements based on unverified facts and unreliable information that lead to interference in the internal affairs of the country in contrary to the diplomatic code of conduct and the Charter of the United Nations.

Detection of Further Omicron Cases in Myanmar

Among the laboratory samples of the COVID-19 infected people returning from foreign countries through Relief Flights, laboratory samples suspected to be Omicron were sent to the National Health Laboratory on 3 February 2022 and the SARS-CoV-2 Variant Omicron was found in 28 laboratory samples.

Until 6 February 2022, there are a total of 348 SARS-CoV-2 Variant Omicron cases: 264 cases were detected from returnees from abroad and 84 cases were detected from people infected locally.

The 264 Omicron cases are 244 Myanmar nationals and 20 foreigners-40 returned from the UAE, 54 returned from Malaysia, 79 returned from India, 21 from Thailand, 18 from Philippines, 34 from Singapore, two from Russia, 14 from Korea, one from Japan and one from Indonesia by Relief Flights. There are 84 Omicron cases of local infection including 48 residents from Tamu township, 20 from Kalay township and 16 from Yangon.

- COVID-19 vaccines were distributed to Nay Pyi Taw Council Territory, Mandalay, Bago, Thegon, Shwedaung, Minhla, Tharrawaddy, Nyaunglebin, Daik-U, Waw, Thanatpin, Kawa and Mingaladon townships by Cold Chain Delivery Logistics vehicles.

The Ministry of Health is conducting COVID-19 tests regularly, 332 new cases of COVID-19 were found from testing a total of 24,333 samples and the infected rates are 1.36 percent on 6 February. The incident took place when the officer and his wife were going outside. The explosion left one refrigerator, four tin boxes and other furniture damaged.
- On 2 February, Ko Myo Min Tun, a resident of Mingalar ward was shot to death

by two PDF terrorists in Taik Kyi township of Yangon region while he was sending his son to Myoma Basic Education High School. He died on the spot with the gunshot wounds.

- On 3 February, PDF terrorists conducted an arson attack on the Basic Education sub-High School in Lat Kaung village of Patheingyi Township of Mandalay Region. The fire outbreak left the destruction of textbooks kept in the school (worth about K300,000) and the fire did not burn the school building.

PDF Terrorists Launch Bombing and Arson Attacks on Non-military Targets of Departmental Buildings

NUG, CRPH and their subordinate units of PDF terrorist groups are attempting to influence the people with fears by assassinating and threatening the administrative officials to disrupt the State government administrative mechanism. Moreover, they are also blowing up and burning down the non-military targets of religious buildings, departmental offices, residential houses, hospitals, health centres and schools, using homemade mines/bombs.

- On 31 January, as PDF terrorists launched bomb attacks on Township Development Committee Office in Sar Taung Township of Sagaing region, nine

windows glasses of the office building, one sink and one water cooler were damaged.

- On 1 February, some 30 PDF terrorists with a vehicle and five motorcycles arrived at the toll-gate built by Shwe Taung Company and blew up it using homemade IEDs causing damages worth about K1,00 million.

The township departmental offices burnt down by terrorists were: the Township Development Committee office; the Department of Forestry office, the Department of Agriculture Land Management and Statistics office; the Audit office; Township Department of Rural Development Office; the Department of Agriculture and Irrigation Office; the Fire Services Department office and fire trucks; and the building of Union Solidarity and Development Party office in the ward.

Under the guidance of NUG grasping the ideology of utter devastation, PDF terrorists are committing heinous motiveless crimes

of arson attacks, reckless shootings and bombing attacks on government offices, State-owned buildings, privately-owned buildings and toll-gates collecting toll taxes and public residences, inflicting damages on public interests and communication in addition to abductions and brutal killings of innocent civilians. The people are disgusted by terrorist acts and also want international community to denounce their acts.

It is reported that security forces members continue necessary measures to identify and arrest the terrorists who committed the crimes of arson and bomb attacks on State-owned buildings, privately-owned buildings.

Terrorists Attack Philanthropic Vehicles Carrying COVID-19 Vaccines by Blowing up Remote Mines

On 2 February, the officials of health department in Sagaing region went to the public hospital of Monywa township to take out COVID-19 vaccines with two Toyota Hiace philanthropic vehicles with license plates “SGG 4L-3365 and HSE/1613. On the way back to Sagaing township, the vehicles were attacked by PDF terrorists using an IED between the mileposts of 61-mile-2-furlong and 3-furlong on the Monywa-Mandaly road in Chaung-U township. No injury was reported in the incident but front windshield of HSE/1613 vehicle shattered and left rear wheel of the vehicle was damaged with tyre blowout.

State Administration Council is emphasizing the COVID-19 prevention, control and treatment activities. However, PDF terrorists, under the instructions of NUG, so far have made 37 terrorists attacks against the COVID-19 precautionary measures. Such inhumane crimes committed by the terrorists are literally the bioterrorism that cannot be accepted by International communities and any other organizations. Since such heinous acts of terrorists are apparently the war crimes, the people want international communities to oppose the terrorists.

A Terrorist Killed in an IED Blast while Planting it Beside Belin-Natkyi Road to Inflict Damages to Innocent Civilians

Under the instruction of NUG, the PDF terrorists are blowing up the public places using grenades and remote IEDs in order to control the people with fear. In making IEDs for violent acts, it is observed that they often get killed in blasts as they make the dangerous explosives without sufficient skills and little knowledge.

On 2 February, a blast occurred beside the Belin-Natkyi road in Belin township of Mon state. According to the information, security forces arrived at the scene to make further investigations and found that a terrorist was killed in an IED blast making his body dismembered while at-

tempting to plant the IED three feet away to the left of Bridge No (1/4) to inflict casualties of innocent civilians and security forces using the bridge. A small battery and a circuit were found and confiscated at the scene.

Regarding the terrorist who got killed in an IED blast during his attempt to plant it on the roadside to inflict civilian casualties, a death case was opened by security forces in accord with prescribed police procedures.

Actions Continue against Unscrupulous Persons who Follow and Make Incitements and Propaganda of CRPH and NUG Terrorist Groups, their Subordinates and Colluded Groups

The entire population has already been informed not to follow the incitements and propaganda made by CRPH and NUG, which were declared terrorist groups, their subordinates and colluded groups. In spite of that, some unscrupulous persons made incitements and propaganda to disrupt the State peace and stability via social media. Therefore, necessary actions have been taken against them in line with law. In this regard:

- On 2 February, five from Yangon region and two from Magway region, totaling 7 were taken legal actions.
- On 3 February, one from Nay Pyi Taw Union Territory, 14 from Yangon region, 15 from Mandalay region, one from Kayin state and two from Shan state, totaling 33 were taken legal actions.
- On 4 February, one from Naypyidaw Union Territory, two from Kayin state, two from Bago region and five from Yangon region, totaling 10 were taken legal actions.
- On 5 February, one from Naypyidaw Union Territory, one from Sagaing region, one from Thaninthayi region, five from Yangon region and three from Shan state, totaling 11 were taken legal actions.
- On 6 February, four from Bago region, seven from Mandalay region and four from Yangon region, totaling 15 were taken legal actions. From 27 January to 6 February, legal actions were taken against a total of 177 people under the law.

It is reported that necessary actions will be continued against the instigators and unscrupulous persons making propaganda.

Offenders Convicted of Contacting with Terrorist Groups and Committing Terrorist Acts by Military Tribunal

On 2 February 2022, the following offenders who committed the acts of terrorism and were in contact with terrorist groups were convicted and given respective sentences under military tribunal as follows:

- Offenders Htet Ko Oo (aka) Ka Tone living in Dagon Myothit (Seikkan) township, was sentenced to ‘life imprisonment’ under Sections 505 (a) (a) of the Penal Code and 50 (I) of Counter Terrorism Law for contacting with terrorist groups, being involved actively in the riots, keeping arms and ammunitions secretly in possession and committing the

crime of violent bomb attack.

- Two Offenders including Wai Yan Htet (aka) Naing Gyi living in Thingangyun township, Yangon Region were sentenced respectively to ‘life imprisonment’ under Sections 50 (A) of Counter Terrorism Law as they committed the violent acts of bomb attacks.

Regarding the fugitives out of the above offenders, it is reported that arrest warrants have been issued under Section 87 and 88 of the Criminal Procedure Code.

Former State Counsellor Daw Aung San Suu Kyi Prosecuted again under Anti-Corruption Law

Regarding the complaint against the activities concerning the former State Counsellor Daw Aung San Suu Kyi were found the corruptions, the inspection team of the Anti-Corruption Commission inspected the complaint against her under the law as follows:

- She Received US\$600,000 and seven Visces of Academy Gold given by the former Yangon Region Chief Minister.
- The State lost more than K5,200 million because of leasing the 1.86 acres of land and building to open the Daw Khin Kyi Foundation (headquarters) without paying fair value.
- Moreover, the State lost more than K19 billion due to payment of less than the fair value for 101.33 acres of land in Ot-tarathiri township and 23.855 acres of land in Pobbathiri township to be used for the Daw Khin Kyi Foundation.
- More than K1,600 million from public donations to Daw Khin Kyi Foundation

was used to build the residence of Foundation Chairperson. The former State Counsellor was charged under Section 55 of the Anti-Corruption Law for the above cases.

According to further findings, it is reported that the first complaint against the former State Counsellor Daw Aung San Suu Kyi was prosecuted under Section 55 of the Anti-Corruption Law at the No. (5) Area Police Station of Zabuthiri township on 3 February for receiving US\$550,000 as a donation to Daw Khin Kyi Foundation to facilitate the business activities of a private entrepreneur in four instalments in 2019 and 2020.

Seizures of Narcotic Drugs in January 2022



Seizures of narcotic drugs worth K24.5 billion in Patheingyi township

Members of anti-narcotic task force from Ministry of Home Affairs of Myanmar are putting stress on seizures of narcotic drugs, and the seizures in January 2022 were as follows:

- From 1 to 31 January, a total of 916 drug-related offenders including 826 males and 90 females were arrested across the country. Along with them, MMK 113,925.325 million worth: 75.285 kilos of opium, 208.963 kilos of heroin, 13,588,712 stimulant tablets, 0.188 kilos of stimulant pieces, 3,317.909 kilos of Ice (crystal meth), 20.669 kilos of marijuana, 57.99 kilos of concentrated opium solid, 0.7 kilos of brown powder heroin, 0.261 kilos of low-grade opium, 1.4

litres of concentrated opium, 157.1424 kilos of Kratom leaves, 53.299 kilos of Kratom powder, 7.05 litres of Kratom liquid, 13.52 kilos of Ketamine, 14,050 kilos of Sodium cyanide and 18,600 litres of Ethynol were seized.

The arrested drug-related offenders were handed over to the relevant police stations and effective legal actions are being taken against them. Members of anti-narcotic drugs task force joining hands with security forces members are making further efforts to identify and arrest drug-related offenders for the eradication of narcotic drugs.
