The Chairman of the State Administration Council (SAC) Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing delivered a speech at the meeting with regional, district and township-level departmental personnel of Ayeyawady Region at Pathein city on 4 July. During the meeting, the Prime Minister stressed the following points:

- As coaches carrying businessmen as well as tourists are arriving in the Ayeyawady region in large numbers, road improvement has become a priority case.
- Yangon-Pathein highway upgrading project must meet the ASEAN standards. In addition, Pathein airport will be upgraded.
- The Ayeyawady region is a rice bowl of Myanmar. It is also an honourable region which takes the top level in many business areas.
- The SAC has temporarily taken over State duties because vote rigging occurred during 2020 elections. Utmost restraint is exercised in dealing with terrorism, which appeared due to political exploitations, in accord with the law.
- The government continues to work in accord with the law as it always adheres

- to the 2008 Constitution. Every race and country is moving forward. They will not look back nor stop. So, Myanmar must also continue to move forward as it should not be left behind.
- It is learnt that the literacy rate of the country stands at 92 percent. However, most of the literate people can only read and write and received primary education. According to population censuses, there are only a few educated people.
- As successive governments have taken measures to promote the government education system, the government is implementing plans to promote education. The country will lag behind others if there are only a few educated people.
- The businesspersons are necessary to carry out manufacturing activities based on agriculture and livestock breeding for economic development.
- To improve administrative tasks and to carry out development tasks more conveniently, new districts were formed and administrative tasks will be carried out more effectively based on the district level.
- As it is necessary to open agriculture and

livestock breeding and engineering training schools to carry out agriculture and livestock breeding tasks and industrial activities successfully, measures are being taken to open agriculture and livestock breeding institutes at the district level.

- Emphasis should be placed not on expansion of acreage but on boosting peracre yields on land resources. If mixand multi- crops can be grown, yields can be boosted.
- All those concerned are urged to work for the development of fish and prawn farming and try to be able to export marine products every year.
- By exerting efforts for industrial development, job opportunities can be created and the number of migrant workers can be reduced.
- It is necessary to consider breaking with tradition in carrying out the tasks for development, economy and growth.

Changes should be made without having deep-seated belief if thought that it will be fine.

- A government needs to be an administrative body that has won the people's trust and credibility. We are not doing politics but management for the interest of the State for the development of the nation.
- The Prime Minister, being proud of being a head of civil servants rather than a head of state, urged civil servants to make efforts in assigned duties for the interest of the State.

After the meeting, the Chairman of the SAC Prime Minister and party inspected the construction of the nine-storey extended building of Pathein General Hospital and fulfilled the needs on the reports by officials. Then, they paid homage to Shwemuhtaw Mahaceti Pagoda, the pride of Pathein, made cash donations to the fund of the pagoda and left the necessary instructions.

#### Chairman of State Administration Council Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services Senior General Min Aung Hlaing Delivers Speech at the Meeting with Officers, other Ranks and Families of Pathein Station



The Chairman of the State Administration Council (SAC) Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services Senior General Min Aung Hlaing delivered a speech at the meeting with officers, other ranks and their family members of Pathein Station of South-West Command on 4 July. During the meeting, the Senior General stressed the following points:

- Participation of the Tatmadaw in the leading role of national politics of the State is based on the need of the State, and it is necessary to correctly understand the undertakings of the Tatmadaw for the national interests of the State due to political changes in successive eras.
- According to the State history, geographical conditions and current situation, the Tatmadaw participates in the national cause of the State and the leading role in national politics in accord with the constitution.
- Many other factors demand peace and stability based on political and security trends till today. To restore peace and stability, the country needs a firm institution. Such an institution is the Tatmadaw

- which will control the nation as a guardian of the State.
- Myanmar has been facing low qualification of education in successive eras. People have a lesser number of educated persons. Consequently, they have a narrow scope of knowledge.
- Health and fitness are of importance in increasing the number of educated persons, so it is necessary to uplift education qualifications in harmony with the health and fitness of the entire nation. It is necessary to take adequate time for the future of the nation by enhancing the education qualification of the entire nation which is the basis for the country within at least five to 10 years with might and main.
- Instigation of colonialists and different opinions have been sparking the ethnics armed conflicts since the time when the nation had regained independence. Although the generations changed, there remain armed conflicts of ethnicities till today. Only when these armed conflicts of ethnicities cease can development tasks be undertaken.

The Chairman of the State Administration Council (SAC) Commander-in-Chief of Defences Senior General Min Aung Hlaing, accompanied by entourages, inspected Pathein Air Base Headquarters on 4 July. After the Senior General heard reports presented by officials, he stressed the following points:

- For regional and territorial waters security, patrolling tasks in air and water spaces must be carried out through radar while the regional military command and air and naval bases need to cooperate in and be always ready for ensuing the rule of law and regional security.
- Security awareness and knowledge are necessary along the seashores and in the delta.
- Regarding agriculture and livestock breeding, a system must be adopted based on interrelationship and high yield.
- The Senior General gave instructions on successful operation of Tatmadawowned agricultural and livestock farms so that Tatmadaw families can consume fish, meat, eggs and vegetables adequately at cheap prices. Then, the Senior

General and party inspected the Karki King duck farm, the broiler farm and the seasonal vegetable plantation of the Air Base.

The Chairman of the SAC Commanderin-Chief of Defence Services Senior General Min Aung Hlaing and party inspected the enhancement of the capacity of riverbed soil on the strand road in Ward 1 of Pathein. After hearing the reports, the Senior General highlighted the following points:

- The oceangoing vessels used to enter and exit Pathein. If repair and renovation measures are to be taken for ocean vessels to enter, commodity flow of the town will be quicker.
- Likewise, systematic storing of the Ngawin River water will benefit agriculture.
- As Ayeyawady Region has just an average of over 120 rainy days a year, water resources must be tapped through solar power and river-water pumping projects, and fresh water must be systematically used.

### Joint Operation Exercise (Sea Shield-2022) Involving Strategic Surface and Underwater Operations to Enhance State's Defence Capability Held

The Tatmadaw is conducting the Tatmadaw (Army, Navy and Air) exercises to thoroughly defend the sovereignty and territory of the State and to ehnance its Defence capability. This year's Sea Shield-2022 of strategic surface and underwater operation exercise is being conducted with the participation of attack submarines Minye Theinkhathu and Minye Kyaw Htin from the Tatmadaw (Navy) including war vessels and helicopters in the Myanmar seas off the

coast of Rakhine State starting on 1 July 2022.

Chairman of the State Administration Council (SAC) Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services Senior General Min Aung Hlaing, accompanied by Commander-in-Chief (Navy) Admiral Moe Aung, Commander-in-Chief (Air) General Tun Aung, the commander of Southwest Command and officials observed the naval exercise Sea

Shield-2022 involving strategic surface and underwater operations.

The Chairman of the SAC Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services and party arrived on board the UMS Mottama in the Bay of Bengal by helicopter to inspect the naval vessels in the exercise. The Senior General heard reports on the purpose of the Sea Shield-2022 which is in accord with the guidance of the Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services, and the surface and underwater naval exercise involving surface ships, submarine and helicopters presented by the Commander-in-Chief (Navy).

After hearing the reports, the Chairman of the SAC Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services said as the Tatmadaw is playing a leading role to defend every territory of the State, it should always have security knowledge and awareness. It should notice all possible outcomes from the defence point of view, classify and effectively use all information.

Naval vessels from the exercises saluted the Chairman of the SAC Commander -in-Chief of Defence Services in Single Line Formation. In the VBSS drill section, Navy Seals conducted the Visit, Board, Search and Seizure procedure to raid a suspicious foreign merchant ship with the use of an anchor launcher. Then, frigates UMS

Hsinbyushin and UMS Kyansittha performed the CASEX A-2 exercise to conduct joint surveillance of submarines. The war vessels in the exercise changed the battle line formation to attack the targets of the enemy at the sea in the marine enemy defence operation zone and totally assaulted targets of enemies with naval artilleries and machine guns.

The Senior General boarding the UMS Mottama viewed the practical firing of torpedos, naval artilleries and machine guns to the above and underwater enemy targets after completion of the operation on defending a range of submarines and the submarine operations.

Afterwards, the Chairman of the State Administration Council Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services delivered a speech to the officers and other ranks participating in the exercises as follows:

- The naval exercises were firstly conducted as the naval and air joint military exercises in 2009. These exercises improved year by year.
- Myanmar possesses some 1,300 miles of coastal line with more than 144,000 square miles of water territory. Hence, the Tatmadaw (Navy) alone cannot cover the vast water territory.

- He said that to become a navy with combat power, the Tatmadaw (Navy) must have the readiness of war vessels, readiness of weapons and systems and readiness of naval men similar to the three aspects of readiness in Tatmadaw (Army).

Then, the Chairman of the SAC Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services presented gifts for officers and other ranks who participated in the exercises. Later, the

Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services received the honorary emblem of the Sea Shield-2022 presented by Commander-in-Chief (Navy).

Then, participants continued the naval drills of Battle Damage Assessment, RAS, Fire Fighting and Damage Control, Search and Rescue and Towing.

# On behalf of Chairman of State Administration Council Prime Minister, SAC Vice-Chairman Deputy Prime Minister Vice-Senior General Soe Win Delivers a Speech to Myanmar Women's Day Ceremony



On behalf of Chairman of the State Administration Council Prime Minister, the SAC Vice-Chairman Deputy Prime Minister Vice-Senior General Soe Win gave a video message to the ceremony to mark the Myanmar Women's Day which falls on 3 July 2022 as follows:

- As in other countries, Myanmar observed the International Women's Day for 2022, under the theme "Gender equality today for a sustainable tomorrow" on 8 March 2022.
- Myanmar Women's Day came into existence after the 4<sup>th</sup> World Women's Conference in Beijing in 1995.
- According to the Beijing declaration from the Conference, the government formed the Myanmar National Committee for Women's Affairs on 3 July 1996 to ensure gender equality for the entire womenfolk with their male counterparts in all walks of life; to enhance and de-

- velop their abilities and to prevent all means of violence against women, and the day has also been designated as the Myanmar Women's Day.
- Day by day, it can be seen that the role of women is improving in all areas and sectors and today, they stand shoulder to shoulder with men in all fields.
- Therefore, the 'Myanmar Women's Day' is held annually at a national level to reflect women's role and capacity.
- In regional cooperation also, the country is actively participating in the ASEAN Committee on Women–ACW, ASEAN Commission on the Promotion and Protection of the Rights of Women and Children-ACWC and ASEAN Women for Peace Registry-AWPR.
- Myanmar holds a zero-tolerance policy on sexual abuse. As a sign of international cooperation in preventing violence

against women, the country signed Joint Communique on Prevention and Response to Conflict Related Sexual Violence in December 2018.

- Since the bill on preventing violence against women has been finished and plans are under way for legislation to give effective punishment to offenders, women can be protected more effectively.
- It is seen that there is a large number of women who have taken the roles in defence and security sectors of the State.
   The Myanmar Armed Forces has turned out female cadets for the Tatmadaw (Army, Navy and Air) and they are discharging duties in keeping abreast of male.
- The Defence Services Medical Academy will recruit female cadets for training. Likewise, female police members are discharging duties similar to male ones at the Myanmar Police Force.
- Therefore, it is seen that the Ministry of Defence and the Ministry of Home Affairs present awards to outstanding women annually whenever Myanmar Women's Day falls.
- Relevant ministries, international organizations and civil society organizations are to cooperate with one another for ensuring peace and economic development, eliminating violence against women and girls and having endurance against natural disasters prioritized by the government.
- A literacy rate for women above 15 accounted for 86.3 per cent and men, 92.4 per cent. Hence, it is necessary to en-

- courage women to study modern education and conduct vocational courses for women so as to grasp the job opportunities.
- In order to reduce the impacts on economy due to COVID-19 pandemic, relevant ministries and organizations are urged to develop and implement pilot projects for rural women to continue to operate their small businesses that generate incomes for them; to resume small businesses that were suspended due to COVID-19 and to create job opportunities for women who do not have sources for incomes.

During the tenure of the State Administration Council, foreign trade was increased through border trade posts and regular trade routes

- Starting from 1 April to 17 June in 2022-2023 FY, the value of exports has reached USD 313.577 million while the value of imports was USD 40.076 million in Myanmar-China border trade through Muse border trade post in Shan state (North). The total trade value reached to USD 353.653 million.
- In June, 83,926 tonnes of rice and 62,168 tonnes of broken rice, totalling 146,094 tonnes were exported to 27 countries by 38 domestic export compa-

- nies. 125,374 tons were exported by maritime route and 20,720 tons by border trade posts.
- USD 322.441 million in total were generated from the export of 426,643.36 tons of pulses from 1 April to 17 June.

Recently, border trade has been steadily improving as border gates have used the system of driver replacement. 150,000 to 200,000 tonnes of rice and broken rice in average have been exported per month to foreign countries within this fiscal year. It is expected that about two million tonnes of rice will be exported. Various kinds of pulses are mostly exported to Asian countries and European Nations.

### A Buddhist Monk from Sasana Wuntha Monastery in Daung Thar Village of Pauk Township Brutally Killed by PDF terrorists

It is sorrowfully found out that the terrorists of political extremists are committing crimes of blowing up the religious buildings, sites and monasteries sacred by Buddhism people, and abducting and brutally killing the Buddhist monks as well.

When Sayadaw Bhaddanta Pawara of 59 (12 monastic years) from Sasana Wuntha monastery in Daung Thar village of Pauk township in Magway region went to Lelan village on his motorbike, PDF terrorists stopped the motorbike and arrested the Sayadaw for no reasons. He was then taken to

Kyar Pyit Kan village and chopped by the terrorists. It is reported that the Sayadaw passed away with knife wounds on his neck at the scene.

From 1 February to 4 July, as a result of motiveless killings by terrorists, a total of fifty Buddhist monks and a nun were dead while 20 monks and a nun injured. Security forces joining hands together with locals are taking security measures to identify and arrest the terrorists who abducted and killed the monks in the incident.

U Zaw Win Thein of 43 is a primary assistant teacher from Maung Taw Basic Education Primary School and his younger sister Ma Ohnmar Win of 27 is also a primary assistant teacher from Thayet Khon Basic Education Primary School. On 3 July, while both of them were together at their home in Thayet Khon village of Kawlin township in Sagaing, some 20 PDF terrorists arrived there. They then abducted both of them to the spot near Maung Thoon Gon bridge and shot them recklessly to death, it is reported.

Under the course of utter devastation, by the instructions of NUG terrorist group, PDF terrorists are carrying out IED and arson attacks against schools in order to lose the students' rights to peaceful learning. In addition to those, terrorists killed education staff and teachers brutally and wantonly, who do not join the CDM campaign but participate in uplift of education quality. Until 5 July, 17 male and 17 female teachers were killed brutally and other 13 male and female teachers got injured in the terrorists' killings.

Security forces are carrying out necessary investigations to identify and arrest those who were involved in the crimes and take punitive legal action against them.

- From 29 June to 5 July, four from Nay Pyi Taw Council Territory, 11 from Yangon region, two from Bago region, 11 from Mandalay region, two from Magway region, two from Ayeyarwaddy region, two from Tanintharyi region, one from Sagaing region, six from Rakhine state and five from Kachin state, totaling 46 were arrested.
- From 27 January to 5 July, legal actions were taken against a total of 613 people under the law.
