
During the peace talk, the Senior General expressed the following points –

Myanmar Objects and Dissociates the Paragraph on “Developments in Myanmar” in the Joint Communiqué of the 55th ASEAN Foreign Ministers’ Meeting

The Ministry objects to the usage of a “lack of progress” on the implementation of the ASEAN five-point consensus stated in the paragraph on “Developments in Myanmar” in the Joint Communiqué of the 55th ASEAN Foreign Ministers’ Meeting and the usage of four criminals as they are incorrectly referred to them as “political activists”. Therefore, the Ministry issued a state-

ment that Myanmar didn’t participate in the 55th AMM and related meetings as it is obviously contradictory to Article 5 of the ASEAN Charter on “Rights and Obligations”.

Myanmar received the invitation from Cambodia, the current Chair of ASEAN, to the non-political representative from Myanmar to attend the 55th ASEAN Foreign Ministers' Meeting and Related Meetings from 31 July 2022 to 6 August 2022 in Phnom Penh, Cambodia. Myanmar didn't participate in the 55th AMM and related meetings as it is obviously contradictory to Article 5 of the ASEAN Charter on "Rights and Obligations".

Myanmar accepted the ASEAN five-point consensus as a responsible member of ASEAN. When the ASEAN five-point consensus was discussed, Myanmar clearly stated that it will be undertaken based on evolving domestic situation of the country, the interest of the country, and the principles of the ASEAN Charter and ASEAN Way and ASEAN spirit. ASEAN should respect the right of every Member State to refrain from interference in the internal affairs of fellow member states, subversion and coercion. ASEAN should also respect Myanmar's efforts to manage its internal affairs in line with the State Constitution (2008), and the existing laws and regulations of one country.

The Ministry objects to the usage of a "lack of progress" on the implementation of the ASEAN five-point consensus stated in the paragraph on "Developments in Myanmar" in the Joint Communiqué of the 55th ASEAN Foreign Ministers' Meeting as it neglects Myanmar's efforts on its implementation.

Myanmar never fails in its endeavours to find peace and tranquillity in the country while closely and constructively cooperating with the special envoy of the current ASEAN Chair in the implementation of the five-point consensus. Ongoing peace efforts for the restoration of democracy in Myanmar by adopting five-point roadmap led by the Chairman of the State Administration Council himself are notable progress. In order to achieve enduring peace for the entire nation, the Chairman of the State Administration Council met with leaders of ten Ethnic Armed Organizations (EAOs), and the Peace Negotiation Committee met with EAOs, political parties and peace-seeking organizations for 75 times and had a frank discussion with them to achieve peace across the country.

The Government has always been providing timely information on the terrorist activities of NUG and PDF and the loss of innocent lives and damages caused by those activities despite the government's all-out efforts for peace in every corner of the country.

If ASEAN member States and external partners genuinely wish to help Myanmar in restoring normalcy, they should not encourage engaging with terrorist groups such as NUG and PDF and should avoid any actions that could encourage terrorism.

The provision of Humanitarian Assistance through the AHA Centre is another tangible progress made under the five-point consensus. While giving special consideration to the safety and security of humanitarian personnel, the Myanmar government will continue facilitating the delivery of broader humanitarian assistance to the people in an equitable and non-discriminatory manner.

Therefore, ASEAN should avoid any one-sided assessment of the implementation of the five-point consensus. Progress of implementation of the ASEAN five-point consensus

should be assessed in an objective and fair manner based on the factual updates and situations on the ground.

The Ministry strongly objects to and rejects the Joint Statement issued by the AICHR representatives of Malaysia, Indonesia, the Philippines, Thailand and Singapore and some ASEAN member states' expression of their concerns on the execution of four criminals as they are incorrectly referred to them as "political activists".

Those criminals are executed not because of being democracy activists but because they are found guilty of masterminding, inciting, supporting, arming and committing terrorist activities which caused tremendous loss of innocent lives. Myanmar already explained and sent letters to the Chair and other ASEAN member states about the terrorist activities of those four criminals along with actual facts and data. Hence, it is inappropriate to express those four criminals as "political activists".

Myanmar will continue to implement its Five-Point Future Plan and will also constructively cooperate with ASEAN while adhering to the "important principles" enshrined in the ASEAN Charter and in line with ASEAN practices. Myanmar will continue facilitating and cooperating with the special envoy of the current ASEAN Chair in the implementation of the ASEAN five-point consensus by Myanmar-owned and Myanmar-led process without compromising its national sovereignty.

Myanmar believes that ASEAN can maintain its unity and centrality in the long-term only if all ASEAN member states respect the provisions and basic principles of the ASEAN Charter, especially equality, inclusiveness, sovereignty and non-interference in the internal affairs of ASEAN Member States.

Therefore, Myanmar rejects and dissociates the paragraph on "Developments in Myanmar" in the Joint Communiqué of the 55th ASEAN Foreign Ministers' Meeting.

Central Bank of Myanmar Issues Notification No 36/2022

The Central Bank of Myanmar issued Notification No 36/2022 on 5 August in which exporters have to exchange 65 per cent of incomes obtained from exportation

with Myanmar kyat in line with the prescribed directives from Notification No 12/2022 of the Central Bank of Myanmar.

Press Release

1. The Central Bank of Myanmar hereby issued this notification by exercising the authority entrusted under Sub-section (b) of Section 49 of the Foreign Exchange Management Law.
2. The Central Bank of Myanmar issued Notification No 12/2022 dated 3 April 2022 related to earnings of foreign exchange of those who reside in the country receiving from abroad and remittance of the foreign exchange abroad.
3. Exporters have to exchange 65 per cent of incomes obtained from exportation with Myanmar kyat in line with the prescribed directives from Paragraph 2 mentioned in Notification No 12/2022 of the Central Bank of Myanmar.
4. This notification must be effective as of the issuance date.
5. If anyone does not follow this notification, they will face action to be taken under the Foreign Exchange Management Law.

National-level Committee on Resettlement of IDPs and Closure of Temporary IDP Camps Holds on its Coordination Meeting (2/2022)



The National-level Committee on Resettlement of IDPs and Closure of Temporary IDP Camps held its meeting (2/2022) on 3 August at the Ministry of Border Affairs in Nay Pyi Taw.

In the meeting, Chairman of the National-level Committee on Resettlement of IDPs and Closure of Temporary IDP Camps highlighted the following points:

- With donation cash, construction of 88 houses and repair works of 25 houses have been completed for resettlement of IDPs in Myitkyina and Wiangmaw township of Kachin state. A total of 595 houses have been constructed for the resettlement of IDPs in Myitkyina, Moemauk, Mansi, Putao and Chipwi townships of Kachin State.
- Two IDP camps were closed in Hlaingbwe and Myainggyingu area of Kayin State and 463 households were resettled.
- In Paletwa Township area of Chin State, the Committee is providing cash assistance of over K418 million for 891 households to return home. Arrangements has been made to provide over K236 million for 500 households for their return to home.
- The Committee made efforts to repair houses and entry roads of the villages, have access of water as well as electricity, and construct monasteries, medical clinics as well as schools for 323 households in Lakkar village Mrouk-U township, 82 households in Pharpyo (Rakhine) village of Minbya township and 368 households in Kyauktalone camp of Kyauk Phyu in Rakhine State.

- The Committee provided cash assistance at designated rates for 127 houses destroyed by fire in Panlong and Chaung Sar village tracts in Namtu township, and made efforts, such as exploration of land plots, construction of houses and concrete roads, provisions of access to electricity and drinking water to construct 57 houses at low price for IPDs taking shelter in two IDP camps of Myoma ward in Mantong township, Shan state.
- Within one year and three months from March of 2021 to end of June of 2022, the Committee could manage necessary tasks for over 40,903 IDPs of 8,862 households to return home and resettle. The Chairman of the Committee called on attendees to make efforts to help IDPs return to their original places in the coming dry season.

The Vice-Chairperson of the National-level Committee Union Minister for Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement Dr. Thet Thet Khaing explained provisions of relief aid, foodstuffs, COVID-19 vaccination programme for IDPs, collection of information and social provisions on IDPs in camps, ongoing works and future plans for closure of IDP camps and recent provisions of aids to IDPs.

The Chairman of National-level Committee on Resettlement of IDPs and Closure of Temporary IDP Camps Lt.Gen Tun Tun Naung, the Vice-Chairman of the Committee Union Minister for Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement Dr. Thet Thet Khaing, deputy ministers of committee members, permanent secretaries and officials attended the meeting while state-level committee members attended it via videoconferencing.

- **The construction of 708 houses in total was completed for the resettlement of IDPs in Kachin state.**
- **Two IDP camps were closed in Hlaingbwe and Myainggyingu area of Kayin State and the resettlement of 463 households were completed.**
- **In Paletwa Township area of Chin State, the Committee is providing cash assistance of over K418 million for 891 households IDPs to return home. Arrangements has been made to provide over K236 million for 500 households for their return to home.**
- **The Committee made efforts to repair houses, have access of water as well as electricity, and construct medical clinics and schools for 773 households in Rakhine State.**
- **The Committee provided cash assistance at designated rates for 127 houses destroyed by fire in Shan state, and made efforts, such as exploration of land plots, construction of houses and concrete roads, provisions of access to electricity and drinking water to construct 57 houses at low price for IPDs.**

- **Within one year and three months from March of 2021 to end of June of 2022, the Committee could manage necessary tasks for over 40,903 IDPs of 8,862 households to return home and resettle. The Chairman of the Committee called on attendees to make efforts to help IDPs return to their original places in the coming dry season.**

PDF Members with no Crime Records Returning Legal Fold Entrusted to their Parents



The ceremony of entrusting PDF members, who completed trainings in the areas of some EAOs and returned to legal fold without committing any crime, to their respective parents was held at the hall of a local battalion in Pyay military station area in Bago region on 6 August. The officials from the regional governments provided cash assistance to six PDF members (five males and one female) from Pyay township. They were entrusted to the care of their parents and guardians after they had signed the document of pledge and handed over their weapons to authorities.

At present, the State's government has released an announcement stating that organizations or groups including PDFs are welcomed if they want to enter the legal fold for their normal civilian lives by surrendering their weapons following rules and regulations to participate in future work plans of the country. From 6 June to 6 August 2022, a total of 247 persons including 195 males and 52 females have already entered the legal fold.

PDF Terrorists Make Disruptive Acts against Education Sector Development to Create Uneducated Classes in Society in some Townships

With the cruel intentions to lose the rights of children to education, create uneducated classes in society and gain support from the people due to fear, so-called NUG terrorist group and its subordinate PDF terrorists are using various means to disrupt the development of education sector, such as intimidation and coercion, abductions and killings of students, teachers and parents; bomb and arson attacks on educational infrastructures; putting teaching/learning aids and textbooks to the torch; and taking those things forcibly.

On 2 August, U Badu (50), a staff of the Basic Education Sub-High School in Tongmawa village of Paletwa township of Chin state, transported seven students to Rimawa village from the school by his motor boat. On the way to Tongmawa village, terrorists on the right bank of the Kaladan

River fired small arms at them at the location which is two furlongs away from the Rimawa village.

Due to the attack, U Badu who drove the boat got injured with bullet wounds in his left wrist and his neck, Ma Khin Thida of 14, the daughter of U Taninla got injured with bullet wounds on her legs, Mg Aung Lin Win of 11, the son of U Lin Aung got injured with one bullet wound in his back. Moreover, Mg Nay Min Tun of 11, the son of U Aung Phar and Mg Than Myint of 11, the son of U Tun Hla Aung were killed with serious bullet wounds in their backs.

It is reported that security personnel are doing necessary investigations to locate and apprehend the terrorists involved in the afore-mentioned attack and take punitive legal actions against them in accordance with the law.

- Due to the shootings of the terrorists on 2 August, U Badu who is the staff of the Basic Education Sub-High School in Tongma village of Paletwa township, Ma Khin Thida of 14, and Mg Aung Lin Win of 11, got injured with bullet wounds. Mg Nay Min Tun, 11, and Mg Than Myint, 11, were killed with serious bullet wounds in their backs.

Innocent Civilians Killed and Injured in so-called PDF Terrorists' Attack on Twinma Village in Myaing Township

Some 20 PDF terrorists arrived in the Twinma village of Myaing township in Magway region in the morning of August 6. They fired small arms at U Thar Bo's yard and torched the houses inside. Due to the terrorists' attack, the 11 people staying temporarily inside the yard including a two-year-old toddler, a five-year-old child and a junior assistance teacher (seven males and four females) were killed and 12 other people (seven males and five female) were injured. Moreover, it was also reported that two residents of the villages were forcibly abducted after being accused of 'informants/ dalan' by the terrorists.

According to the accounts of the victims of terrorist attacks -

- The terrorists burnt down the Citizenship Scrutiny Cards and motorcycles belonging to locals. As the terrorists also recklessly fired machine guns, both adults and children came out of the house and begged the terrorist, "You can kill the adults but please spare the children's lives". However, the terrorists shot all of them to death.
- The terrorists even inhumanely and brutally attempted to kill a toddler and another baby with disabilities as well.

Based on the one-sided extreme factionalism of "my adversary is anyone who holds opposing views," PDF terrorist groups are wantonly committing brutal murders on innocent civilians living peacefully and those

who opposes terrorists' views, accusing the civilians of 'traitor/Dalan'. The entire public despises terrorists and want them to be apprehended and sentenced punitively.

Security personnel went to the scene and searched the area around the village for the terrorists. In addition, security personnel performed necessary security tasks throughout the village and transported injured victims to the Pakokku public hospital for medical treatment. According to reports, of-

officials provided the injured victims and bereaved family members cash assistance contributed by the Magway Region government and the North Western Command.

A Terrorist Violently Attacks a Security Force Member Doing Security Duties at Basic Education Sub-High School in Hmawzar Ywarma Village, Pyay Township

Terrorist groups are intimidating and exploiting the youths in dangerous terrorist attacks and also persuading the ones who cannot rationally think what is right or wrong. In this regard, a 14-year-old boy called Aung Myint Myat, a resident of Hmawzar Ywarma village violently attacked one of security force members who were doing security duties for the Basic Education Sub-High School in the village. He stabbed the back of the security personnel with a sharp dagger which has three-inch-long handle, eight-inch-long and one-and-half-wide blade. The security force member got a three-inch-deep stab wound. The violent attacker attempted to escape when other security personnel arrested him. Therefore, security personnel had to fire warning shots

and he was arrested with injury around 100-meter away from the school.

The injured security personnel and the terrorist were transported to the military hospital to take necessary treatments and the terrorist was under interrogation. The combined efforts of parents, guardians and teachers are required to guide their children not to lead to the wrong path so as to ensure such incidents will not happen again in the future. It is reported that security force members continue necessary security measures to ensure peaceful learning of students with joys.

- A 14-year-old boy called Aung Myint Myat, a resident of Hmawzar Ywarma village violently attacked one of security force members who were doing security duties for the Basic Education Sub-High School in the village stabbing the back of the security personnel with a sharp dagger which has three-inch-long handle, eight-inch-long and one-and-half-wide blade. The security force member got a three-inch-deep stab wound.

Terrorists who Killed Administrator and Wife of Shwe Nant Thar Village in Mingaladon Township Identified and Arrested

The PDF terrorists under NUG terrorist group were making assassinations of people and bombing attacks on public buildings working with government in order to disrupt the government mechanism for no reasons. Acting on a tip-off from the people who do not want the aforementioned acts of terrorism, the combined security forces arrested the terrorists who killed innocent civilians by accusing them of “Dalan/Informant”: Zeyar Win, 20, Naing Aung Tun (aka) Datha, 19, Ye` Zaw Lin (aka) Skate, 22, Tin Ko Ko, 56, Aung Ko Ko, 25; and Khin Mya (aka) Khin Htay, 55, Tin Tin Maw, 45, Thin Yanant Hlaing (aka) Phyu Phway, 16, who helped them to flee, totally eight perpetrators at a house located on Hninsi road in No (1) ward of Shwemyayar village-tract in Hmawbi township.

According to the confessions of the ar-

rested perpetrators,

- In February 2022, five offenders Naing Aung Tun (aka) Datha, Ye` Zaw Lin (aka) Skate, Aung Ko Ko, and Soe Min San (still on the run) and Chit Phyo Wai (aka) Sanshay (still on the run) attended terrorist explosive training conducted in KNLA Brigade (6) area for one month connecting with the arrangements of ward administrator fugitive Ohn Zaw Myint, a former member of NLD party, living in Konetalabaung village of Mingaladon township.
- After finishing the training, Naing Aung Tun (aka) Datha, Ye` Zaw Lin (aka) Skate, Aung Ko Ko, Soe Min San, and Chit Phyo Wai (aka) Sanshay with the arrangements of ward administrator fugitives Ohn Zaw Myint, a former member

of NLD party and Tin Ko ko, hired a house on Hninsi road in No (1) ward of Shwemyayar village-tract in Hmawbi township. Meanwhile, with an intent to disrupt the State government mechanism, they carried out assassinations of ward administrators who are main pillar of the government mechanism and innocent civilians by accusing them of “Dalan/Informant”.

- On 1 August 2022, Zeyar Win, Naing Aung Tun (aka) Datha, Aung Ko Ko, Soe Min San (still on the run) and Chit Phyo Wai (aka) Sanshay (still on the run) led by ward administrator fugitive offenders Ohn Zaw Myint, a former member of NLD party, totally six offenders made plans to kill Shwe Nant Thar village administrator of Mingaladon township U Win Naing Tun and wife Daw Hay Mar Lwin when they send their children to school, through Signal mobile application.
- When the village administrator and wife were on the way to send two children to school by car around 8 am on 2 August, Zeyar Win stopped the vehicle by throwing a remote IED in front of the vehicle. At that time, Naing Aung Tun (aka) Datha shot Daw Hay Mar Lwin to death and Soe Min San shot administrator U Win Naing Tun to death, for five times using pistols.
- Meanwhile, as Zeyar Win found two children at the backseats of the car who are still alive, he planned to explode the car by setting up a remote IED in the car with devil thoughts.
- However, the attempt was prevented by security force members arriving in time, saving the lives of two kids after the remote IED was defused.
- Aung Ko Ko attacked the house of ward administration by throwing and explod-

ing an IED. The assassination attempt was recorded as a video footage by Chit Phyo Wai (aka) San Shay using his phone camera. He was arrested while trying to escape from arrest at his house.

According to the confessions of the arrested offenders, it was found out that they committed the crimes of murder for two times in Mingalardon township under the instructions of fugitive Ohn Zaw Myint –

- On 9 February 2022, Zayyar Win and other offenders at large, Arka Win, Min Min Zaw, Ko Tu (aka) Thar Gyi attempted to assassinate the ward administrator U Nay Lin and hundred houses elder U Ye Thwin living on Hninsi road, Myayadanar ward, Thingankyungyi village tract, Mingalardon township shooting them with pistols. In the incident, U Nay Lin was killed and U Ye Thwin was injured.
- On 8 June 2022, Zayyar Win and Arka Win, an offender at large followed up and shot Kaung Myint Win (aka) Ko Ni driving a motorbike on main road of Gugyi Gon village of Mingalardon township. When the motorbike slipped and fell, the victim was beaten to death.
- It was also found out that fugitive Ohn Zaw Myint NLD party member masterminded the assassinations of innocent civilians. Perpetrators were paid K30,000 for killing ward administrator U Nay Lin, K50,000 for killing Kaung Myint Win (aka) Ko Ni and K120,000 for killing ward administrator U Win Naing Tun and his wife Daw Haymar Lwin. He also provided necessary weapons/ammunition to the perpetrators.

It is reported that further measures will be taken to take punitive actions against the arrested offenders.

The concerned authorities interrogated Thinzar Wint Kyaw (aka) Thinzar and Nang Mwe San who earned money by distributing sexually revealing photos and videos that harm Myanmar national culture and dignity that Myanmar women should maintain. In this regard, the following points were found out -

- Since August 2021, Thinzar Wint Kyaw has opened an account named Thinzar Wint Kyaw on the Exantria website run by Mr. Rafal living in the U.S. She has earned money from posting sexually revealing photos and videos on the website.
- Since September 2020, Nang Mwe San has opened an account named Nang Mwe San on the Onlyfans website run by Mr. Rafal. Furthermore, she has also opened an account named Nang Mwe San on the Exantria website and earned money from posting sexually revealing photos and videos on the websites.
- In addition to Thinzar Wint Kyaw and Nang Mwe San, some other sexy models are also earning money by posting sexually revealing photos and videos on the Exantria website.

Therefore, measures are being taken to charge Thinzar Wint Kyaw and Nang Mwe San under Section 33 (a) of the Electronic Transactions Law for earning money by distributing sexually revealing photos and videos. They had no women's shame as well as modesty that should be maintained by Myanmar women, and their activities could harm national culture as well as dignity and make Myanmar women inferior in

international community. Those who are making Myanmar culture harm and Myanmar women's shame and dignity defamatory would be identified and taken legal action in accordance with the law, according to the concerned administrative body.
