Guidelines from Chairman of State Administration Council Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing at Coordination Meeting on Undertakings of Union Government



The coordination meeting on undertakings of the Union government was held at the meeting hall of the Office of the Chairman of the State Administration Council on 8 August with the presence of Vice-Chairman of the State Administration Council (SAC) Deputy Prime Minister Vice-Senior General Soe Win, council members, the Secretary and the Joint Secretary, Union ministers, Nay Pyi Taw council chairman, chief ministers of regions and states and chairmen of self-administered areas.

During the meeting, the guidelines from the Chairman of the SAC Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing are as follows:

- The Prime Minister had requested the relevant persons by himself and through the officials to call the Hluttaw only after solving the voting frauds that occurred in 2020 general election. Consequently, as they attempted to convene the parliament, the SAC had to declare a state of emergency and assume State duties.
- Since its assumption, the SAC has been checking voter lists and it took deserved action against officials in causing the vote rigging process.
- As Citizenship Scrutiny Cards (CSCs) were issued to those who cast votes without turning 18 in the 2020 election, almost 100 percent of work process has completed except some instable areas. Likewise, CSCs are being issued to the citizens who do not have the cards.
- CSCs are issued to all ethnic people and those who have the right to citizenship as quickly as possible. On the other hand, officials need to restrict the misconducts in issuing the CSC to non-citizenship persons.
- In the roadmap of the nation, the second point emphasizes resurging of businesses with loss triggered by the COVID-19 pandemic and vaccination. Infection of disease reaches 0.3 percent in the nation, lessening the infection rate rather than neighbouring countries. But, it is not to

be satisfied with the downtrend of infection rate, and vaccination process must be done continuously.

- Everybody needs to accept vaccination for full times. If one person takes at least four times of vaccination, preventive measures of COVID-19 will be more effective, according to the medical experts.
- More than 50 percent of some 55 million population are workable. According to the census, the workable forces and job opportunities can be seen in the nation.
- At present, it is necessary to utilize the workable human resources and improve the capacity of the youths who will be a workforce in the future generations. Hence, it is necessary to encourage the education sector with the implementation of the KG+9 plan. Moreover, technologies will be taught at universities and colleges for the improvement of technologies.
- Reviewing the manufacturing and export sectors during the tenure of NLD government, it was found that export item and the economy of the country started falling as of 2018. Rice is the main export item and it is necessary to boost rice

yields.

- Schools have been reopened since last year to nurture human resources and the matriculation examinations were held. Emphasis must now be placed on enabling all school-age children to go to school when schools are reopened in June 2023.
- Although the Constitution stipulates primary education as the compulsory one for all, the current government creates learning opportunities for students to pursue KG+9 education for free of charge.
- New districts were designated to carry out smoothly administrative functions. The agriculture and livestock, education and health sectors are ones that can enhance the efficiencies of the country.
- Arrangements are being made to be able to affiliate technical high schools and agriculture and livestock farming high schools with basic education high schools in 50 districts with a view to turning out required human resources for agriculture and livestock farming sectors. Outstanding students among them are required to study at institutes of agri-

- culture and livestock breeding while others can continue to study art and science subjects as usual.
- Prosperity of the country and the production of abundant supplies of food have been designated as two national goals. To produce abundant supplies of food, there are many things the country can carry out. Compared with neighbouring countries, cultivation and yields of oil palm are very low in Myanmar. It is important to exert efforts to meet the production target of oil palm.
 - If effective measures are taken for the cultivation and production of oil crops, it is expected that there will be sufficiency in edible oil and its import will be reduced after the second cultivation season in 2023.
 - As regards the production of rice, there are 15 million acres of monsoon paddy and about 3 million acres of summer paddy. For monsoon paddy, about 75 baskets per yield are estimated. At the first stage, if efforts are made to produce about 80 baskets of monsoon paddy per acre, an additional 75 million baskets can be produced.
 - Likewise, it is estimated to produce about 90 baskets of summer paddy per acre. And efforts to produce around 95 baskets will see an additional 15 million baskets at the first stage. As a result, there will be a total increase of 90 million baskets of rice, resulting in a rise in the national income. The government is also required to provide necessary agricultural inputs such as fertilizers, pesticides and irrigation water.
 - With regards to the livestock sector, the breeding of layers and pigs can generate income within a short time, so capitals and investments must be provided. The chief ministers must focus on regional development tasks covering their whole regions and states. Only when the socio-economic improvement of rural people, will national progress be achieved speedily.
 - Touching on the energy sector, petroleum and its products worth about US\$-1.3 billion have to be imported. Therefore, imports must be reduced. The country can produce petroleum to a certain extent, and it is necessary to extract petroleum systematically from shallow wells in some regions. Systematic

measures must be taken for oil production to benefit the country.

- Regionally sufficient generation of electricity will be helpful to ensure improvement of socioeconomic life of local people to some extent and reduce nation's power demand as well.
- Only if it is healthy, education, economic and other matters can be carried out. Therefore, chief ministers and officials are to work carefully themselves and push and supervise others at different

levels under them from all aspects.

Later, the Chairman of Nay Pyi Taw Council, chief ministers of regions and states reported on the accomplishments of administration, security and rule of law, social, economic, education, health, agriculture and livestock, and development activities and further plans to be carried out in the respective areas with the use of Powerpoint slides. Finally, the Senior General gave necessary advice and instructions.

During the meeting, chief ministers of regions and states and chairpersons of the Self-Administered Zones reported on the

progress of administration, security, the rule of law, social, economic, education, health, agriculture and livestock and development affairs, and further plans in respective regions and states including the Self-Administered Zones, and Union ministers on the implementation of missions and visions, work progress, future programs, international cooperation, and undertakings



for the economic development of the State and restoration of peace and stability with the help of Powerpoint slides.

After hearing the reports, the Chairman of the State Administration Council (SAC) Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing stressed the following points:

- As local food sufficiency is crucial in regions and states, priority must be given to paddy cultivation so as to increase per-acre yield.
- As the Ministry of Planning and Finance set up a separate fund of K400 billion allotted from the National Natural Disaster Management Fund for the economic development of the nation, the government will arrange to spend the fund on the supply of fertilizers, quality seeds of crops and fuel for the farmers for the

cultivation of summer paddy and green gram this year on the first priority.

- It is required to export rice and green gram from these farmlands under the leadership of the government. Depending on the yield of paddy and beans, farmers will have a chance to gain proper benefits.

The meeting was attended by Vice-Chairman of the SAC Deputy Prime Minister Vice-Senior General Soe Win, council members, the Secretary and the Joint Secretary, Union-level officials, Union ministers, the Nay Pyi Taw Council chairman, chief ministers of regions and states, chairpersons of self-administered areas.

Union Election Commission Makes Preparations to Practice PR System

The Union Election Commission-UEC is a body responsible to hold the free and fair elections and therefore, UEC reached an agreement with political parties after holding meetings for 4 times to change the proportional representation (PR) system in upcoming elections instead of the first-past-the-post (FPTP) system that was used in the previous elections.

At present, the on-job service capacity building course No. (4/2022) for staff of officers who will perform duties in the Union Election Commission and the various levels of UEC sub-commission offices are being

opened from 8 to 19 August so that the staff know and understand well the office works and ethics relating to election process. The training is aimed to teach trainee staff about the PR system. The trainee officers are also urged to be apolitical and impartial in the election process and they also must observe Myanmar Official Secret Act after studying it thoroughly as a citizen or a civil servant.

Efforts Made to Increase Export Volume in Four Months of 2022-2023 FY

During the tenure of the State Administration Council Government, efforts are being made to increase export volume through border trade posts and regular trade routes. In this regard, the exports were as follows:

- Within four months of the fiscal year 2022-2023, from 1 April to 29 July, a total of USD 426.411 million worth of 558,700.276 tonnes of varieties of pulses and beans were exported to foreign markets. Of them, USD 332.411 million worth of 419,120.309 tonnes of varieties of pulses and beans were exported to abroad via sea routes, and USD 94 million worth of 139,579.967 tonnes of varieties of pulses and beans were exported through border trade posts.
- Within four months of the fiscal year 2022-2023, from 1 April to 31 July, a total of USD 91.584 million was earned from the export of 80,334.423 tonnes of fish to abroad. Of them, USD 48.089 million was earned from the export of 33,288.818 tonnes of fish were exported to abroad through regular trade, and USD 43.495 million worth of 47,045.605 tonnes of fish through border trade.
- Over 600 tonnes of coffee have been exported to foreign markets in four months this year, from April to 8 August, when



coffee is harvested. In comparison to the same period last year, coffee is being exported at a good price, and demand for coffee is increasing.

USD 258.403 million. A tonne of Myanma special-class coffee exported to foreign markets currently costs between USD 7,000 and USD 8,000, it is reported.

Within six months of the fiscal year 2021-2022, the export of 243,529.656 tonnes of fish to other countries generated



Relief and Rescue Tasks Carried out for Flood Victims in Yatsauk and Tachileik Townships



Heavy rains that fell in Yatsauk and Pindaya townships of Shan state (South) and Tachileik township of Shan state (East) in the evening of 7 August caused floods in Zawgyi creek of Yatsauk township as well as the downtown area of Tachileik.

At the flooded areas, relevant officials, local military personnel, together with members of Myanmar Red Cross Society and firefighters carried out relief and rescue tasks such as moving flood victims to a stadium; removing debris of landslides using machineries; and getting ready of lifeboats

to carry out emergency rescues.

Moreover, Commander of the Eastern Command, Major General Ni Lin Aung and responsible persons provided foodstuffs, commodities and cash assistance to each of 343 households and they encouraged the flood victims who were given medical treatment.

Foodstuffs and Commodities Provided to Locals Fleeing from Arson Attacks of PDF Terrorists



The ceremony of providing foodstuffs and other commodities to 72 households fleeing from the arson attacks committed by PDF terrorists in Sagaing region to Khaymar Thiwun monastery in Aungmyaytharzan township of Mandalay region was held at the community hall of the monastery on 9 August. The ceremony was attended by the Commander of Central Command, ministers of the regional government, departmental officials and the people temporarily taking shelter in the monastery.

The Commander of Central Command and the officials encouraged the people who were taking necessary health care services provided by Tatmadaw medical teams from a local military medical battalion and attended their requirements.

Over 20,000 International Tourists Visit Yangon Region During Four-Month Period from April to July

Over 20,000 international tourists and visitors from 64 countries arrived Yangon region during four months from April to end of July. There are 22,241 international tourists and visitors in total including 12,944 on Business Visa, 962 visitors including diplomats on official visa, 5,928 people on regular visa, and 2,407 on tourist visa. Most of them are from China and Thailand.

Myanmar has allowed the entry of international flights since 17 April 2022 and

moreover, e-Visa (tourist) has also been granted since 20 May 2022 in order to promote the tourism sector development as well as harmonize with the tourism businesses of neighbouring countries. Furthermore, applying online-Visa (Business) has also been allowed since 1 April 2022 so that foreign investors and entrepreneurs can easily visit Myanmar.

Actions Continue against Unscrupulous Persons who Follow and Make Incitements and Propaganda of CRPH and NUG Terrorist Groups, their Subordinates and Colluded Groups

The entire population has already been informed not to follow the incitements and propaganda made by CRPH and NUG declared as terrorist groups, their subordinates and colluded groups. In spite of that, some unscrupulous persons are making incitements and propaganda to disrupt the State peace and stability via social media. Therefore, necessary actions have been taken against them in line with law. In this regard:

- From 3 to 9 August, two from Nay Pyi Taw Council Territory, eleven from Yangon region, eight from Mandalay region, one from Bago region, three from Magway region, one from Tanintharyi region and five from Shan state, totaling 31

were arrested.

- From 27 January to 9 August, legal actions were taken against a total of 769 people under the law.

It is reported that necessary actions will be continued against such instigators and unscrupulous persons making propaganda and instigations.

Members of anti-narcotic task force from Ministry of Home Affairs joining hands together with security personnel are putting stress on anti-narcotic measures, and the seizures of narcotic drugs in July 2022 were as follows:

- From 1 to 31 July, a total of 911 drug-related offenders including 778 males and 133 females were arrested across the country. Along with them, a total of MMK 64,643.455 million (over US\$ 34 million) worth narcotic drugs: 132.427 kilos of opium; 200.995 kilos of heroin; 5,906,342 stimulant tablets; 0.012 kilos of stimulant pieces; 1,260.583 kilos of Ice (crystal meth); 132.070 kilos of marijuana; 4 kilos of concentrated opium; 0.465 kilos of low-quality opium; 66.423 kilos of Kratom leaves; 355.98 kilos of Kratom powder; 8.25 litres of Kratom

liquid; 4,486 Ecstasy tablets; 0.08 kilos of Ecstasy pieces; 1.231 kilos of Ketamine; 1.404 kilos of Happy Water; 1,500 kilos of caffeine; 7,175 kilos of Sodium Acetate; 112,740 kilos of ammonium nitrate; 400 kilos of bone char; 380 kilos of Sodium Chloride; 6,750 kilos of Sodium Carbonate; 2,400 kilos of Potassium Sulfate; 2,000 kilos of Copper Sulfate; 14,500 kilos of Theophylline and 60 other accessories of mould were seized.

The arrested drug-related offenders were handed over to the relevant police stations and punitive actions are being taken against them in accordance with the law. Members of anti-narcotic drugs task force joining hands with security force members are making further efforts to identify and arrest drug-related offenders for the eradication of narcotic drugs.
