## Chairman of State Administration Council Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services Senior General Min Aung Hlaing Receives the Peace Delegation led by Chair of Restoration Council of Shan State (RCSS) General Yawd Serk



The Chairman of the State Administration Council (SAC) Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services Senior General Min Aung Hlaing received the peace delegation led by the Chair of the Restoration Council of Shan State (RCSS) General Yawd Serk at the parlour of Bayintnaung Villa in Nay Pyi Taw on 29 August to talk about peace issues.

At the peace talk, the Chairman of the SAC Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services highlighted the following points:

- Efforts being made to exercise the genuine disciplined multiparty democratic system and build the Union based on democracy and federalism as the political vision.
- The future plans that will be continued to restore the peace based on the Constitution (2008) and the Nationwide Cease-fire Agreement (NCA).

The Chair of the RCSS and party dis-

cussed their attitudes on building the Union based on democracy and federalism, peace process and regional development and exercising federalism, solving political problems through political means, promoting social lives of people, eliminating armed conflicts and terrorism and further plans to be carried out. Afterwards, the Chairman of the SAC Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services discussed the following points:

- The importance of geographic conditions of the country and the adoption of foreign policy in conformity with our country.
- The needs to exercise federalism that harmonized with our country's geographic situation, national characteristics and culture while most countries are exercising democracy and federalism.

tem, and the efforts being made to enhance the education sector for gaining educated persons so as to encourage the development of the country in a great momentum.

- Efforts being implemented for the development of ethnic people's areas. Then, The both sides frankly exchanged views on peace and regional development issues.

The peace talk was attended by the Chairman of the SAC Commander-in-Chief

## Opening Ceremony of Meeting on Enhancement of Agriculture Sector and Socioeconomic Life of Farmers through Inclusive Irrigation System Held



The ceremony to open the meeting on the enhancement of the agriculture sector and socioeconomic life of farmers through Inclusive Irrigation System was held at the Agricultural Education and Rural Development Training School in Nay Pyi Taw on 26 August, with the presence of the Chairman of the State Administration Council (SAC) Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing.

Also present were SAC members, Union ministers, the Nay Pyi Taw Council chairman, the Commander of Nay Pyi Taw Command, deputy ministers, permanent secretaries, directors-general, rectors, farmers who are leaders of region/state water utilization teams and members and officials.

During the ceremony, the Chairman of the SAC Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing delivered a speech as follows:

- The SAC is developing the agriculture sector that is the core of a developed and prosper country with abundant supply of food through the adoption and implementation of objectives and policies.
- Water supply system is of vital importance in crop and rural development.

Hence the government is prioritizing the irrigation projects.

- Agriculture and water are indivisible. Farmers should develop the farming sector through the effective use of water resources provided by the irrigation projects.
- According to expert calculation, depending on soil condition, average water need for the success of an acre of rice which is main crop is five acre feet or 1.35 million gallons.
- Means should be sought in applying technology-based irrigation system especially in summer or the dry season to prevent water loss.
- Therefore, measures are being taken for the formation of Water User Groups (WUG) for respective irrigation canals and the Water User Association (WUA) to enable the groups to cooperate and to strengthen them extensively for the durability of water supply canals and facilities and the development of water supply systems.
- The system can bring about benefits such as prevention of water disputes as farmers themselves can participate in the

system and expansion of irrigation areas by minimizing water losses and utilizing irrigation water beneficially.

- Currently, the government has set up the K230 billion fund allotted from the K400 billion State economic promotion fund for successfully growing 850,000 acres of summer paddy and 500,000 acres of green gram through a mutual farming system as of the coming season.
- As the government has been fulfilling the need for agricultural water supply tasks constantly for the development of the agriculture sector, farmers are required to cooperate for promotion of socio-economic lives of farmers and the farming sector in line with the term **“Participatory Irrigation System”**.

Then, the Chairman of the SAC Prime Minister and party viewed round the exhibition booths, water pumps, water spraying equipment, model plantations of crops using farming tools and machines, high and low mobile solar water pumping systems, measurement of Global Water Flow Probe, demonstrations of the placing linings for re-

spective types of canals, supplying water by installing sluice gates and monsoon paddy cultivation by irrigation system. The Union Minister for Agriculture, Livestock and Irrigation and responsible officials conducted the Senior General. Then, he asked questions on the reports, discussed them and gave necessary instructions.

The round-table discussion on the enhancement of the agriculture sector and socioeconomic life of farmers through Inclusive Irrigation System was aimed to assist water supply systems for agriculture through systematic management of water resources in Myanmar and to cooperate for promotion of socio-economic lives of farmers through the participation of framers by organizing WUG/WUA. The meeting was attended by 200 farmers who are leaders of water user groups from regions and states with an attendance of 250 more farmers through online virtual.

**Excerpts from Speech Delivered by Chairman of State Administration Council  
Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing to 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary  
(Diamond Jubilee) of Sarpay Beikman**



The excerpts from the speech delivered by the Chairman of the State Administration Council (SAC) Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing to the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary (Diamond Jubilee) of Sarpay Beikman are as follows:

- Today, 26<sup>th</sup> August of 2022, is the auspicious occasion of the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary (Diamond Jubilee) of Sarpay Beikman, which has a high tradition in the literary world in Myanmar. In those days, there were many things which attributed to the development of a race and a nation. These days, however, “education is the only thing” needed for development is accepted by all nations around the globe.
- In order to enable the learners to constantly read, study and share in successive eras, we, humans started to use books, which are distributed around the globe extensively.
- With the passage of time, the learning materials have changed, commencing from stone inscriptions to palm leaf manuscripts, to books and to electronic books. The changes in technology have created different formats; yet, the very essence is the same.
- Since the pre-independence period, Sarpay Beikman has consistently been performing literary duties to its utmost until today, disseminating knowledge among the people. It is a great institution which we are all very much proud of.
- With the objective of opening the eyes of the public, the Luhtu Ahlin, the Luhtu Eik Hsaung and Luhtu Tekkatho were first published. In 1954, Myanmar Encyclopaedia Volume I (Ka-Kote) was published, and in 1977, Vol 15 was published.
- Sarpay Beikman also published the school textbooks, the Terms Bank, 50-year Sarsin, Sarpay Beikman Magazine, Pyithu Letswe, Thutapadetha and Shwe Thway (children journal).

- Additionally, for the development of Myanmar literature, the Sarpay Beikman Manuscript Award was created with the publishing tasks. Then, this award was extended to Fine Arts Award, the National Literary Award and the Sarpay Beikman Manuscript Award. Commencing in 2001, the Lifetime National Literary Award for Literary Achievement, which is the highest national award, has been given. Now, we have already conferred this award on 34 great writers.
- Most of the national literary award winners were produced by Sarpay Beikman. In cooperation with Tun Foundation, Myanmar Encyclopaedia books are being edited, and now, Volume I (Ka-Kote) has been updated and published again.
- I myself have read the books published by Sarpay Beikman since my youth. And I have been a member of Sarpay Beikman Library Association. The knowledge I have gained from reading the books, magazines and journals published by Sarpay Beikman in those days is invaluable, and they are still useful these days. And the reading habit has made me learn continuously.
- Currently, our country has trodden on the path to “genuine, disciplined multi-party democracy”.
- Additionally, the democratic system must have an education system which will not adversely affect our country’s national characteristics and culture. The education system is aimed at not teaching democratic politics but it should be aimed at developing good democratic practices. The education system should focus on continuous learning.
- It can be seen that some books published after 2011, especially after 2015 and talks under the literary talks led to a highly divided society against democracy for our country.
- Due to reading good fiction and non-fiction books published by the Sarpay Beikman, the people will have national characters and a nationalistic spirit endowed with knowledge and skill, and it will increase the number of educated new generations who will adore their own culture, language and customs.
- In accord with the theme of Sarpay Beikman’s “**Light, where Darkness was**”, the good literary works were published without “dogmatism and literary views” which may harm the national cause but with the aims of turning out good and able citizens equipped with a good attitude, ideas and knowledge in line with the 38 auspicious ways.
- Only when the number of educated youths increases will a new human society emerge for leading the development of Myanmar’s social economy.
- As our government is building a better State and socio-economic lives prioritizing the interests of the State and ethnic national people in line with the motto of the government “Keep Moving Forward to Achieve Our Goal”, I believe that the Sarpay Beikman is also participating in the work process with the strength of literature.



### **SAC Vice-Chairman Vice-Senior General Soe Win Meets Russia’s Deputy Defence Minister**



ing of 25 August and arrived in Moscow, the Russian Federation in the evening of Local Standard Time.



### **Myanmar Strongly Condemns and Rejects Statements Related to Incidents Took Place in Rakhine State in August 2017**

The issuance of statements by certain countries and organizations including the spokesperson of the United Nations Secretary-General were found to be not only concealing the ARSA's terrorist acts with regard to the incident of 25 August 2017 and ignoring to objectively observe the situation of ethnic people in Rakhine State but also

disregarding constructive measures taken by the Myanmar Government. The contents contained in the statements are of unverifiable sources and tantamount to the interference in the internal affairs of Myanmar. As such, Ministry of Foreign Affairs issued a statement that Myanmar strongly condemns and rejects those statements.

#### **Press Statement**

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs has learnt the issuance of statements by certain countries and organizations including the spokesperson of the United Nations Secretary-General on the anniversary of the incident that took place in Rakhine State on 25 August 2017. The contents and facts contained in their statements not only lack authenticity and are of unverifiable sources but are also found to be one-sided and interfering in the internal affairs of Myanmar.

The incidents that started on 25 August 2017 in Rakhine State were triggered by the coordinated and simultaneous attacks of the ARSA (Arakan Rohingya Salvation Army) terrorist group on 30 police outposts and a Regiment Headquarters. Those terrorist attacks resulted in casualties of both security personnel and innocent civilians. In this regard, with a view to ensuring prevalence of security, peace and stability of the locality and the people, the security personnel had to take necessary measures in accordance with the existing rules and regulations.

The ARSA terrorist group had deliberately orchestrated such incidents to make the people in Rakhine State flee to the other side of the border. They also inflated the numbers of the people who fled due to the terror-threat of ARSA. The Myanmar Government is systematically carrying out verification process to repatriate those who fled the country, in accord with the bilateral agreements.

The Government and people of Myanmar do not recognize and accept the use of the term "Rohingya". Such term is not included in the historical evidence and lacks legal basis. Those using the term are found to be doing so for political purposes. The Myanmar

## **Deputy Minister for Commerce Answers Question on the Rumours about the Sufficiency of Local Rice**

The local prices of rice become volatile due to the fake and fabricated news released by some media agencies via online social media networks. Therefore, with an intent to clarify about the actual situation, Deputy Minister for Commerce U Nyunt Aung responded as follows to the questions raised by media outlets –

- Myanmar had cultivated 15 million acres of monsoon rice accounting for 1,088 million Tinns of rice production and 2 million acres of pre-monsoon rice with 213 million Tinns of rice production in 2021 alone. Therefore, Myanmar accounted for 1,301 million Tinns of rice (13.01 million tonnes) production in total.
- After extracting seeds and wastes, the net remaining rice is 12.282 million tonnes. The estimated requirement to consume for the 55 million people in the country is only 9.88 million tonnes of rice. Therefore, the amount of foreign export is around 2.88 million tonnes of rice.
- The amount of rice export in 2022 up to

August was only 1.338 million tonnes of rice and 0.808 tonnes of broken rice. Therefore, the local remaining rice will be 3.635 million tonnes of rice.

- There will require 3.134 million tonnes of rice from the remaining rice for local consuming for four months from September to December. In the end of September, rice will acquire from the monsoon rice cultivated in this monsoon season of this year. Therefore, people need not worry for the local sufficiency of rice and foreign export of rice will continue as usual, explained the Deputy Minister.

The Ministry of Commerce usually permit the foreign export of agricultural products and basic food items providing that the local sufficiency is secure. Likewise, the export of rice is also systematically permitted after the considering the local sufficiency. The current situation of remaining local rice is fairly sufficient prior to the new production of monsoon rice. Moreover, people need not to worry about the rumours and fake news because the remaining rice is sufficient for local consuming.
