1. The meeting of the National Defence and Security Council took place at the meeting hall of the National Defence and Security Council at 9:30 am today. At the meeting, Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services Senior General Min Aung Hlaing presented the conditions for the implementation of the five-point roadmap of the State Administration Council, situations where national stability and community peace have been emphasized, situations of meetings and discussions with ethnic armed organizations, and operations of terrorist groups under various names, including PDF, which are committing subversive activities in some regions and states under the instructions of NUG. He also reported on the need to extend the declared period for the State of Emergency across the country under Section 425 of the Constitution in order to continue working to return the country to the path of a peaceful and disciplined multiparty democratic system and to hold multiparty democratic general elections under Section 429 of the Constitution of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar.

2. Members of the National Defence and Security Council seconded the submissions of the Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services. Then, all members of the National Defence and Security Council, including the Pro Tem President, unanimously decided to extend further six months of the declared period of the State of Emergency across the nation under Section 425 of the Constitution.

### **Chairman of State Administration Council Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing Delivers a Speech at the Union Government Meeting 5/2022**

The Union Government meeting 5/2022 was held at the meeting hall of the Office of the Chairman of the State Administration Council on 29 July. During the meeting, the Chairman of the State Administration Council (SAC) Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing stressed the following points:

- The SAC has been implementing the five-point roadmap and nine objectives since its assumption of the duties and the goal is to practice multi-party democracy and to build a Union based on democracy and federalism.
- As the results of the 2020 multiparty

democratic general election resulted in political instability, the Tatmadaw had to take responsibility under the Constitution.

- The government is doing the best they can under the Constitution, and they have given outlets regarding politics. Apart from measures to prevent national unrest, party conferences, meetings and inter-party meetings are allowed as democratic political outlets.
- Democracy means dialogue, negotiation and consensus. This can be said to be a “democratic culture”. If these democratic political cultures are destroyed, the sta-



bility of the country will be destroyed. It has been found that such political situations have arisen due to improper use of political outlets.

- The government has already increased the salaries and benefits of the government employees. Civil servants are free from party politics and are to carry out the duty of the country, not to carry out politics. Regarding politics, as a citizen, a citizen has the freedom to act as long as he does not violate specific provisions prohibited by the existing law.
- Regarding international relations, in 2011, while walking on the path of multiparty democracy, some big countries used money and resources to keep those who can do what they want on the political stage. When the people they wanted were no longer on the political stage, the aid stopped for various reasons.
- As regards to the peace, if the government provides for the living and food of the ethnic groups in the areas of armed conflict, it will be able to help in one way. Things desired by the Ethnic Armed Organizations (EAOs) must be fulfilled within the framework of the law.
- Therefore, at the time of the peace talks, we clearly stated our national goals and political goals and were able to have positive discussions. The national goal is the prosperity of the country and the abundance of food for the people.
- We have given political outlets to our political goal and it is necessary to make efforts to achieve peace by using these political outlets.
- Regarding economic development, under the previous government, domestic products were not encouraged and imports were prioritized. Our government is working to make the country's economy recover.
- At this time, in order to develop the domestic economy, we must improve local production. We must encourage the improvement of the quality of local products and the strengthening of manufacturing. Moreover, the government promised K400 billion for the COVID-hit economy.
- Regarding the export and import sectors, the government and private earned over eight billion from exports via border camps and the government's export volume is higher than the private sector. Therefore, it still needs to support SMEs.

- Regarding education, the government reopened all the schools on 2 June including the universities and normal courses. We expected there would be 9.5 million students at the basic education level. Finally, over 7.2 million students attend the school. They all are attending peacefully.
- Improving the education sector plays a key role in a country. If education is not improved, no matter what the country does, there can be no progress. According to our analysis, the education level is low. It is such a sad case. The education level of nearly half or over half of the country's population is under the middle school level. Therefore, if education is not improved, the businesses that run based on education and skills will never be modern ones.
- Israel boasts of proper agriculture, live-stock breeding and technologies as they have many experts. They have a fine economy and income. As they have a proper income, they can have a decent meal, so they have a good immune sys-

tem. Based on these facts, they systematically do exercises and their IQ, which is better than our normally developing country.

- The government cannot emphasize education only. We must promote the socio-economy of the people. Therefore, education reforms do not concern with the Education Ministry alone, but for all.
- Regarding COVID-19, the country testes more positive cases on the returnees. Although the COVID-19 rules are eased, the people should not stay recklessly as the infection rate can be high again.
- The country received 80million COVID-19 vaccines and administered about 72 million. Education and health are the vital role for the development of the country, and the Prime Minister pledged to make efforts for the country to keep "Moving Forward".

Also present were Vice-Chairman of the SAC Deputy Prime Minister Vice-Senior General Soe Win and Union ministers.

During the meeting, the Chairman of the National Natural Disaster Management Committee Vice-Chairman of the State Administration Council (SAC) Deputy Prime Minister Vice-Senior General Soe Win highlighted the following points:

- The changes of the nature of disasters in

the world must be constantly observed. It is required to make preparations with the best arrangement to respond to natural disasters that can occur in Myanmar with the strength of human resources by forecasting the possibilities of disasters depending on seasons and regions.

- It is necessary to conduct preparations, rehearsal and disaster awareness programs as per the natural disaster response project. Preparations must be

made for natural disaster management committees, people and charity organizations to cooperate with each other in overcoming the challenges of natural disasters.

- They must be capable of knowing human resources, infrastructures and usable materials and applying them if required. Officials need to arrange the readiness of the forces to respond to natural disasters with the fulfillment of needs, and arrangements must be made for effectively applying the man and material powers.
- The International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction is observed on 13 October every year. In 2021, the day was marked in accord with the theme “**International co-operation for developing countries to reduce their disaster risk and disaster losses**”. Likewise, public are urged to cooperate to raise their awareness of natural disasters and to participate in the disaster risk reduction by successfully

holding the International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction in 2022.

**Vice-Chairman of State Administration Council Chairman of National Disaster Management Committee Deputy Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services Vice-Senior General Soe Win Encourages Flood Victims in Pyin Oo Lwin and Provides Relief Aids to them**

Vice-Chairman of the State Administration Council (SAC) Chairman of the National Disaster Management Committee Deputy Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services Commander-in-Chief (Army) Vice-Senior General Soe Win, accompanied by officials, encouraged the flood victims in Pyin Oo Lwin on 31 July due to the heavy rainfall there.

Deputy Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services Vice-Senior General Soe Win and party heard reports on the conditions of the heavy rain in Pyin Oo Lwin, flooding of Gelaung creek that caused damages, and relief activities presented by the station commander Brigadier General Zaw Min Latt and Mandalay mayor U Kyaw San with the use of Powerpoint slides at Pyin Oo Lwin military station hall. After hearing the reports, Vice-Chairman of the SAC Chairman of the National Disaster Manage-

ment Committee stressed the following points:

- The matters relating to the local people to cooperate with departmental officials to clean up trashes and debris remaining after flooding as soon as possible because flooding occurred in 9 wards out of 21 wards in Pyin Oo Lwin.
- The conditions on local people to cooperate with military personnel to be a good flow of water along seven miles of length including from the areas of two and half miles where Gelaung creek flows to BE fall.
- The matters relating to the arrangements of relief and restoration activities for schools, hospitals, fences and residential houses that were damaged in flooding at soonest, and the Ministry of Social Welfare Relief and Resettlement to support designated rates for relief activities.

Afterwards, the Chairman of the National Disaster Management Committee Deputy Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services and party inspected Pwe Kauk Waterfall (BE Fall), Kan Taw Lay water outlet, water gate, No (4) Kan Taw Gyi pond and downtown wards that were damaged in flooding and met with about 250 flood victims at Pyin Oo Lwin football ground and encouraged them. During the meeting, the Vice-Senior General encouraged them as follows:

- Now, there are recorded rainfalls in Pyin Oo Lwin within 30 years and that rainfall amounted to 10.47 inches within eight hours.
- On behalf of Prime Minister of the State, the Vice-Senior General, in his capacity as the Chairman of the National Disaster Management Committee arrived here now to make necessary cooperation with officials.
- Weather and natural disaster are very difficult to expect and the government has made necessary preparations to overcome the challenges of various natural disasters.
- Flooding of Gelaung creek occurring in early morning of 31 July damaged some housings and fences of administrative offices and schools, and more than 400 flood victims were taken to relief camps.
- Managing to restore the heavy flood of Gelaung creek back to normal situation during a short period of time from 31 July to 9 am of 1 August was the result of combined efforts of the departmental officials in systematic water management of the Kan Daw Gyi, Kan Daw Lay dams, and the proper preparations to maintain the good water flow of the stream.
- Similarly, that was also the good result of cleaning up blocks of the streams and brooks every week by the cooperative efforts of Tatmadaw and township people.
- Regarding the relief and healthcare activities from township level to regions/state level, all possible measures should be taken immediately and further difficulties should be reported to the State Administration Council.
- Succeeding in conducting the help and relief activities in a short time with the minimum level of damage in such an unexpected condition of natural disaster is

the result of the harmonized and integrated efforts of administrative bodies, security forces, civil societies and township people.

After that, the Chairman of the National Natural Disaster Management Committee Vice-Chairman of the State Administration Council provided cash assistance to the flood victims and moreover, the Chief Minister of the Mandalay region also provided natural disaster relief items to flood victims and officials received them on behalf of the victims.

Heavy rain fell from 2 am to 10 am of 31 July reaching the rainfall of 10.47 inches, highest record in 30 years in Pyin Oo Lwin township. The torrential rain caused floods in 9 out of 21 wards of Pyin Oo Lwin. The water level even reached four feet in some wards leaving houses submerged. The Gelaung creek is 7 miles long and it runs across the town for two and half miles. The two-and-half-mile long area of the creek crossing the town was repaired as a concrete creek with 10 feet in width and 10 feet in depth to ensure better drainage and causing no floods in downtown area. The Gelaung creek functions as a spill way of the Kan Daw Gyi and Kan Daw Lay dams. The previous spill way system of Kan Daw Lay dam was seven-foot wide and two-foot-deep

three water gates and its spill way capacity was 210 cubic/sec. As the spill way system was repaired by upgrading the three water-gates with seven feet in width and five feet in depth to increase the spill way capacity of 525 cubic/sec. Therefore, the Kan Daw Lay dam was not broken in such situation. In case the Kan Daw Lay dam was with the spill way capacity of 210 cubic/sec, the dam might have broken in such situation of heavy rain inflicting large amount of damage to the town of Pyin Oo Lwin. Since the water gates were upgraded, the Kan Daw Gyi lake will have more capacity to hold the waters entering to its four dams, it is reported.

It is reported that activities of beautifying and clean-ups are carried out in each ward of the town by the combined efforts of local people, region government, security force members and township departmental staff.

## Progress of COVID-19 Vaccination in Respective Regions and States



Students vaccinated against COVID-19 in Mandalay region

The Ministry of Health has carried out COVID-19 prevention and control activities in respective regions and states by designating targeted groups and accordingly, vaccination process is being accelerated-

- 4.53 million students aged from five to 18 years, 0.24 million students aged from 15 to 18 and 27.37 million students aged 18 years and above have already received two-time full doses of the COVID-19 vaccine.
- 1.12 million students aged from five to 18 years, 0.13 million students aged from 15 to 18 and 2.83 million students aged 18 years and above have already received the first doses.
- A total of 4,964,284 people have been vaccinated against COVID-19 booster doses in respective regions and states from 1 January to 31 July 2022.
- As of 31 July, 36.22 million people in total have been vaccinated against COVID-19. About 32.14 million people

have received two-time full doses of the vaccine, 4.08 million people have received the first doses and 4.9 million people have been vaccinated against COVID-19 booster doses. A total of 73.26 million people have been inoculated against COVID-19 in Myanmar.

The Ministry of Health is conducting COVID-19 tests regularly, 9 new cases of COVID-19 were detected from testing a total of 4,207 samples accounting for 0.21 percent on 31 July. As of 31 July 2022, a total of 614,092 cases were detected from testing a total of 8,535,914 samples and death-toll reached 19,434.

## Public Notification on Cash Awards for Preventing/Arresting Illegal Trade

Foods that should not be consumed, low-quality consumer goods, illegal drugs and duty-free goods have been entering from various routes into Myanmar. Therefore, the special teams are formed to combat against illegal trade in regions and states and the teams are taking measures of prevention and seizures of illegal trades at trading posts and checkpoints.

The illegal trades inflict certain impacts on the development of national economy. For instance, the illegal trade cause hindrances to legitimate businesses and moreover, small, micro and medium-sized enterprises face difficulties for long-term survival because they are less able to compete with illegal goods in trading. It will be more effective provided that the entire people participate in the process of preventing and

controlling illegal trade activities.

Regarding illegal imports/exports, 30% of the money obtained from fines or holding auctions on the prohibited/seized items are being rewarded to the people who help in arresting the illegal trades and 20% to those who informed about the illegal trades in accordance with the regulations of the Union Government's Order No. 70/2020.

The Illegal Trade Eradication Steering Committee notified the public that the personal data of the informants will be kept confidential and they can report any information about the illegal trades to the phone numbers described in Myawady Daily Newspaper released on 29 July.

On 27 July, the Yangon Region Investment Committee approved ten investments to create 7,013 job opportunities in domestic and the Ministry of Labour has dispatched 2,215

workers under Employment Permit System.

- The Yangon Region Investment Committee approved the following industries: value-added bran manufacturing, CMP garment, bag, and footwear manufacturing, instant vermicelli manufacturing, value-added fish and shrimp manufacturing under the Normal system, and export



of those products.

- The investment amounts are K 3,309.5 million and USD 13.815 million. Two local investments and eight foreign investments will generate 7,013 job opportunities.
- Myanmar workers dispatched to foreign countries under EPS system include new workers for manufacturing, construction, agricultural and livestock industries as well as re-entry workers. From 28 April to 26 July, a total of 2,215 workers were

dispatched to foreign countries.

Myanmar workers have been dispatched to foreign countries since 2009, following the signing of an MOU between the two countries. Since the minimum wage for 2022 has been set at 9,000 won per hour, and the Republic of Korea has strict labour laws, the number of workers has increased, it is reported.

- From 1 April to 15 July in the fiscal year 2022-2023, the export of CMP products generated USD 3,124.043 million; USD 952.848 million via government agencies and USD 2,171.195 million via private sector.
- From 1 April to 22 July in the fiscal year

2022-2023, USD 409.82 million was generated from the export of 539,311.004 tonnes of varieties of pulse and beans; USD 315.815 million from the export of 399,731.037 tonnes via sea routes and USD 94.005 million from the export of 139,579.967 tonnes via border trade posts.

Myanmar exports agricultural, animal, fishery, mineral, forestry, CMP products and other goods to foreign countries. A total of USD 4,813.532 million was generated from the exports within three and a half months, and CMP products were the most foreign export among them, it is reported.


## PDF Terrorists Disrupt the Development of Education Sector to Create Uneducated Classes in Society

Terrorists of political extremist are making nefarious means to disrupt education sector from all sides:

- On 27 July, PDF terrorists set fire to the Basic Education Middle School in Lat-pankone village of Pantanaw township of Ayeyarwady region and they, then, ran away. Due to the fire outbreak, paper documents, textbooks, one iron-cupboard, two wooden-cupboards and one swivel chair in the building comprising school office and library were destroyed in fire.
- On 28 July while U Sai Min Latt of 38, the junior assistant teacher from the Palae Basic Education High School was at home located in Thittayar village of Palae township of Sagaing region, PDF terrorists arrived at his home and shot the gun at and chop the knives at him, U Sai Min Latt got injured with gun and knife wounds.
- An IED explosion took place in the township education office in Aung San ward of Nat Mouk township in Magway region, the window glasses of the school office were crashed.
- Terrorists placed letters of threat on the street in front of Ka Nyone Basic Education Primary School in Ka Nyone ward of Dawei township in Taninthayi region. Similarly, terrorists also placed letters of threat at the spot in front of the houses of U Kyi Tun of 50 and Daw Ni Ni Sint in Hein Dar village of Dawei township. Furthermore, letters of threat were placed on the doormat of the door of school office in the Basic Education Sub-High School of Taung Thar township of Mandalay region.
- A PDF terrorist rang Daw Wah Wah Shwe of 40, senior assistant teacher living in the area of No(2) Basic Education High School in Kalaw township of Shan state (south) and extorted money from her.
- On 30 July, terrorists placed a threatening letter at the door of the headmistress's office in the Basic Education Sub-

Middle School of Kywae Tae (Ywa Ma) in Pakokku township of Magway region.

- When Daw Khin Mar Naing of 38, primary assistant teacher of Thayet Kan Basic Education Primary School of Kamma town in Pakokku township, returned back to her home from school, terrorists shot at her and ran away. Daw Khin Mar Naing got gunshot wounds.

According to the provisions of Geneva Conventions and the international law, terrorists' intentional attacks against non-military targets of schools and non-combatant targets of teachers and students constitute war crimes. With the intention to create uneducated classes in society, the NUG's affiliate PDF terrorists are attacking and destroying educational infrastructures and schools from all sides. Furthermore, they are continuously making various acts of terrorism, such as abductions, murders, intimidations and coercions of innocent civilians as well as civil servants. As a result,


parents express disgust at and oppose terrorists as children's rights to education were being destroyed by terrorists' acts.

It is reported that terrorists made 140 times of arson attacks, 401 times of bombing attacks and 87 times of violence of threat against education staff, leaving 14 male teachers and 18 female teachers as well as six education staff got injured, and 17 male teachers and 17 female teachers as well as three education staff were brutally killed.

Security personnel are doing required investigations to find and apprehend those terrorists involved in the afore-mentioned threats and to take legal action against them. The public was urged to oppose PDF terrorist groups who committed nefarious acts and to help provide the information about terrorists' movements to concerned administration bodies, it is reported.
